MASTER PLUMBERS WOULD ALTER LAW

COMMITTEES HAVE STORMY CONFERENCE

Members of Council Hear Request That Board of Masters Pass on All Applications for Plumbing Licenses

A conference between the building committee of the council and the plumbers in regard to the proposed ordinance governing the sanitary work in Los Angeles last night proved to be a stormy session.

An effort was made on the part of the Master Plumbers' association, which is a national organization, and to which a large initiation fee is charged, to insert a clause in the ordinance forcing every man who desires to go into the plumbing business in Los Angeles to pass an examining board composed of four master plumbers.

The association, represented by a large committee, held the floor for several hours explaining to the council that they inserted this clause in the proposed ordinance solely for the purpose of keeping all the citizens of Los Angeles from dying of typhoid fever.

It finally was admitted that the new ordinance did not differ in any other way from the old law.

It was also shown that the protection of the public from poor plumbing is the duty of the plumbing inspector, and that he would be the only protection under the proposed law.

Attorney Oscar Lawler represented the independent plumbers, and he showed how such a board would control the situation and the plumbing business, for no man could get a license without the sanction of this board.

He cited cases which had been fought out in the courts where such boards had simply denied applicants licenses to keep out competition.

"You master plumbers want to control the plumbing business in Los Angeles, and that is all well and good," continued Lawler, "but you have no right to ask the legislative bodies of this city to do the business up in a bundle and hand it to you."

Several of the independent plumbers showed how, as they say, the National Master Plumbers' association has for years tried to make it impossible for the plumber, no matter what his skill, to secure material from wholesale houses throughout the country by threats of boycott.

So strong is their power in Los Angeles, according to a prominent independent plumber, that there is but one wholesale house in the city where he, or any other independent plumber, can buy material which he has to have in order to make a living.

No agreement was reached and the committee took the question under advisement.

3000 SIGN ANTI-SALOON PETITION

DR. CHAPMAN SAYS HIS CAUSE WILL WIN

Harmony Prevails in the Ranks of the Campaigners, and Followers Are Confident of Victory

Harmony prevails in the ranks of the no-saloon campaigners and the work is progressing even better than was anticipated by the leaders. Not only the members of the Anti-Saloon league, but also all other parties and individuals interested in any way in the abolition of the saloon have joined forces with Dr. Chapman.

Wiley J. Phillips, who stood out for many months for the complete prohibition of the whole liquor traffic, has joined the ranks and decided to do all in his power to help with the first step, believing at some later time he may be able to assist in clearing out the city.

C. J. Hall, who separated from the first prohibition movement, has also sworn allegiance to the standard which Dr. Chapman is bearing, and the Los Angeles W. C. T. U. federation has passed resolutions favoring the movement and offering to lend its assistance in carrying out the work.

Dr. Chapman says: "The petitions asking for a special election for the purpose of determining whether or not the retail liquor traffic will continue to exist are being circulated throughout the city and the men who have them in charge are meeting with success on every side. Two hundred men are engaged in this work and already many of them have reported that their petitions have been filled. Only one petition will be allowed to each man, and the rules regarding the securing of signatures are being observed in every instance, so that there may be no possible chance for a flaw in the legality of the documents."

Dr. Chapman said yesterday that almost 3000 signatures have been secured out of the 4200 necessary to bring the subject before the council. "Our movement is meeting with success on every hand," said Dr. Chapman. "The number of men circulating the petitions will be increased by Sunday, and I predict that the mass meeting to be held in Temple auditorium Sunday afternoon will be one of the greatest ever convened in the interest of such a cause."

All efforts of the leaders are being expended to make this meeting a success. Judge John D. Werks will preside and the principal address will be made by Hon. Will A. Harris.

FAMOUS INVENTOR DEAD

Author of the Combined Harvester Expires at San Jose

By Associated Press. STOCKTON, March 9.—John Cunningham Hout, inventor of the first combined harvester ever used in San Joaquin county and the first successful machine of the kind in the United States, died this morning after an illness that had confined him since November.

Mr. Hout came to this county in the '50s, direct from the east. Finding the raising of grain unprofitable under the existing system of harvesting he conceived the idea of building a combined harvester. The result was a machine with which he in 1876 harvested his crop of 800 acres without taking the machine from the field.

The deceased was 73 years of age and leaves nine children, Mrs. Mrs. James Toothman and Mrs. S. Straight of Fairmount, W. Va.; Thomas, David, William and Frank Hout and Misses Ellen and Margaret Hout of Stockton.

MARQUIS OF ANGLESEY DYING AT MONTE CARLO

English Nobleman, Whose Career of Extravagance Attracted Attention, Hopelessly Sick

By Associated Press. NEW YORK, March 9.—The Marquis of Anglesey, is, according to an American dispatch from Monte Carlo, dying there from consumption. His condition took a sudden turn for the worse Wednesday, and it was reported that he could live but a short time.

The marquis, who was born in 1875, attracted much attention after succeeding to his title through his lavish expenditures on jewels and theatricals. Not long ago he was thrown into bankruptcy with liabilities aggregating nearly \$3,000,000.
