SEARCH FOR BODIES OF STORM VICTIMS IS WITHOUT RESULT

Careful search all of yesterday failed to locate the bodies of any of the five men who were reported drowned at different points Monday as a result of the storm.

A number of police officers and citizens tried in vain to find the bodies of the two men who are supposed to have been swept away and drowned by the current following the collapse of the Seventh street bridge.

The local authorities have not been advised of any casualties outside of Los Angeles. Efforts are being made, however, to locate the bodies of the two men reported drowned near Santa Monica and the one swept away in Cajon pass, it is said.

DAMAGE REPAIRED AND TRAFFIC RESUMED ON ALL THE RAILROADS
