

BOOKIES GET A SOUND DRUBBING

PUBLIC HAS MUCH THE BEST OF BETTING ARGUMENT

George Rose Lays Fifty to One Against Neatness and is Trimmed to the Tune of Several Thousand Dollars

Friday is usually an off day in racing and yet many were of the opinion that yesterday's gathering at Ascot was the biggest of the week.

The public got off winner by scoring with the favorite, Kinsman, in the opening race. The layers were hit hard in the second race when the well played first choice, Belle Dixon, beat out Jardin de Paris, one of the outsiders.

Twelve maidens of the 3 year old and worse division, that have started three or more times this meeting, scrambled over the Slaucon course in the opening event.

Jockey Hogg Falls Off Jockey Hogg, who had the mount on Isabute, fell off rounding the last turn, but was not seriously hurt.

Kinsman turned up an easy winner after getting away none too hot. Manera looked to have a good chance at the head of the stretch but she stopped to nothing in the final eighth and finished fourth.

Belle Dixon Wins The second race on the card was captured by Belle Dixon, the 2 to 1 favorite. Jardin de Paris at 15 to 1 was second, and Swift Queen, the second choice, third.

Neatness at Forty to One La Chata, around 6 to 5, and Search Me at 2 to 1, carried the bulk of the public's good money for two year old race, third on the card.

Dungannon Well Played Dungannon, backed heavily from 14 to 5 to 9 to 5 to win the mile and a sixteenth race, fourth on the program, rewarded her backers handsomely by scoring the easiest kind of a victory over Canejo and Freesias.

El Oros Joits the Books Starter Dwyer sent the field of four away to a flying break for the six furlongs, purse race, for three year olds. Col. Ruppert opening at 2 to 1 and receding to 5 to 2 out on the early pace, closely attended by Blue Coat, a 7 to 1 chance.

W. Kelly Rides a Winner Jockey Willie Kelly, who is no "big ger than the proverbial pint of cider," broke his maiden yesterday, when he piloted Meadowhorn to victory and snatched the sixth race from Mercedes and Bailey.
