CLAREMONT, March 18.—In the second interscholastic field track meet held under the auspices of Pomona college the young athletes of the Los Angeles high school won the championship with an aggregate of 33 points.

The weather was perfect and the track in ideal condition. The events were attended by an enthusiastic crowd of 1500 partisans. The first event was called at 1:20 p. m. and the duration of the meet was two and a half hours.

Richardson of Santa Paula was the star performer of the day, winning eighteen points for his school. A handsome banner will be given to the winner of the field day and relay race.
