
A hit and a completed amble was the Seraphic record in this inning. Cap Dillon ballooned to center and Cravath followed by reaching a high one into Miller's mit.

NAVAJO LOST ON MEXICAN COAST

PROSPECTING TOUR BROUGHT TO SUDDEN END

GASOLINE TANKS EXPLODE

San Diego Yacht Chartered by Allen Frazer Totally Destroyed at San Ignacio—Crew Has Narrow Escape From Death

SAN DIEGO, April 13.—Many members of the South Coast Yacht club will regret to learn that the handsome yawl rigged Navajo, flagship of the Corinthian Yacht club, is no more. She was one of the best cruising yachts on the coast, that is for the comfort and convenience of those making an extended cruise, and Commodore T. P. Converse had given her auxiliary power so that it was not absolutely necessary for him to rely on the caprice of the winds, though he depended largely on sails when out for pleasure. During the races for the Lipton cup last summer Commodore Converse proved a prince of entertainers aboard the flagship, as many of the South coast boys can testify.

A month or more ago Allen Frazer chartered the Navajo to go on a prospecting trip down the coast, furnishing security for the return of the boat and outfitting her at considerable expense. He took Capt. Victor Gunn along as captain and J. Wedekind as sailor. A few days ago came the report that the Navajo was roughly handled in the recent storms along the entire coast, but a reassuring letter was received to the effect that while the yacht was in a blow she was all right and safely anchored in the lagoon at San Ignacio. This was followed yesterday by a letter from Capt. Gunn, in which he tells of the total loss of the yacht. In part of the letter he says:


"Frazer and Wedekind were to stay here and prospect, while I was to take the boat back to San Diego, with two passengers. We did not get very far out—about twelve miles—when there were two explosions and the boat was on fire. We rushed down stairs and emptied two fire extinguishers on the flames without avail, and did the same with the contents of the water tank. The fire was burning near the forward gasoline tank and there was not much time to work. We got the skiff overboard and saved some of our clothing, but all the provisions we could get were three cans of tomatoes, which had to do for both food and water. Soon after we pushed off both tanks blew up and the jigger mast fell overboard. We pulled for the shore and it took us fourteen hours to reach the land at Abregos point, but the Navajo lasted only ten minutes from the time of the first explosion."

The Navajo was built five years ago in this city by Harry K. Chamberlain, who was afterward the commodore of the club. She was forty-seven feet long over all, eleven foot beam and drew seven feet of water. Many cruises she has made to Santa Catalina, Santa Barbara and along the coast south. She was valued at about \$6000.

ALBERT BELL ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF FORGERY

Albert Bell, son of Maj. Horace Bell, was arrested yesterday by Detectives Davis and Roberts and booked at the city jail on a charge of forgery. He is alleged to have passed two fictitious checks on an East First street saloon-keeper named Hickson and to have left town as soon as they were uttered.

The crime which Bell is alleged to have committed took place more than a year ago and since then the local detectives have been biding their time to make the arrest. For nearly two months Bell has been lying in the jails of San Bernardino county awaiting trial on a charge similar to the one which confronts him here.

Last week he was brought to trial at San Bernardino and acquitted. The Los Angeles detectives were notified that they could proceed, so they went to San Bernardino and arrested Bell. He was brought here and will be tried on the forgery charge.
