DR. LEGGO'S COAST RECORD

MOST REMARKABLE HORSE RACED IN WEST

MEETS RAMSHORN TODAY

Winner of Montgomery Handicap and Agile Entered for Kentucky Derby With McCafferty's Colt

Dr. Leggo, who has left California to run in the Kentucky derby and other good races in the east, has left behind many well wishers among racegoers, who have come to look upon him as the best 3-year-old that ever raced on the Pacific coast.

To the racing public in these parts Dr. Leggo, the gallant son of Puryear D out of Stevens, has come to be more of an idol than that good Claude was at any time in his great career.

It is no exaggeration to say that Dr. Leggo is the greatest 3-year-old ever raced on this side of the continent, for his performances go to prove this claim.

Racegoers here will await with interest news of the doings of their favorite in the Kentucky derby, run today, and on through his whole career during the summer season.

He looks to be a real race horse, without the frills, and strength and stamina can be seen in his every line.

As every one knows, Dr. Leggo is a California bred horse, being by Puryear D, a stallion that never before got one of any prominence, and out of Stevens, a mare by imported Watercross out of Polly. Stevens, the dam of the great youngster, was once a popular favorite and won good races in California.

There can be no fault found with the pedigree of Dr. Leggo, and when he was taken into the sales ring in Chicago with a lot of other yearlings to be sold at public auction he at once attracted attention.

There was no fancy price bid on anything that day, but Charley McCafferty secured Leggo for \$1200. He now says that he was confident at the time that he was buying a good youngster, but it is doubtful if he ever dreamed what that same colt would accomplish when he had once got to racing.

As a 2-year-old Dr. Leggo gained but little prominence, but when he had arrived at the age to be classed with the 3-year-old division he immediately blossomed out as a champion.

In him the astute McCafferty thought he had the Burns handicap winner, but before he could be prepared for that race he had a slight attack of sickness, which while not severe was still enough to keep him in the stable.

Although he did not get a chance at the rich Burns handicap, when it came to the derbies he was where he could show his real class.

The Ascot derby was a simple canter for him, and he beat Oxford, a colt that had a reputation as a good one from New York to Los Angeles. The California derby, run at Oakland, was another for him, and he beat the best that were brought out with the greatest ease.

Astonished the Talent

The most surprising race in the career of the great 3-year-old was the special race over three miles of ground. The racing regulars would not believe their own eyes when they saw the name of Dr. Leggo on the list of those entered.

McCafferty knew better than they what a good horse he had, however, and in the race it was Leggo who was favorite in the betting ring.

There are many ifs in racing, but it is almost certain that if Leggo had carried a little more weight and a stronger boy in the long distance event he would have been returned the winner.

As it was, little Tommy Taylor was so tired at the finish that he could hardly dismount, and while Dr. Leggo was beaten by a narrow margin by Elle, he was hardly blowing enough to put out the light of a match.

The race was on Saturday, and on the following Wednesday Dr. Leggo came out and won a handicap at a mile and fifty yards, giving away weight to a field composed of some of the best horses on the track.

The race was run in the track record for time, and those who had predicted that a three-mile race would prove too much for a 3-year-old at this early season began to wonder just what kind of a horse Dr. Leggo was.

In the history of the turf, prominent among the names of iron horses, such as the famous old Logan, Blitzen, Banquet, Claude and others more or less of note, none will better be remembered than that of Dr. Leggo, who can run you a race in any company, at any distance and over any kind of a track that he has ever traveled over.
