

OCEAN PARK TRUSTEES ACT ADVERSELY MEETING LARGELY ATTENDED

Stormy Session in Refusal of City to Renew Privilege of Selling Intoxicants Aboard

At a stormy session of the Ocean Park board of trustees last night the renewal of Carlo Marchetti's license for the sale of liquors at his ship hotel, the Cabrillo, was refused.

The trustees met in the city hall at Venice and the session was attended by great throngs of citizens arrayed on one or the other side of the Kinney-Marchetti faction.

Several witnesses were introduced to testify to the character of Marchetti and the manner in which he conducted the ship hotel.

Attorney Early Rogers appeared for the Kinney faction and Attorney Hunsacker appeared for Marchetti.

The refusal to renew Marchetti's license in no wise affects the continuation of the restaurant and Marchetti, while not discussing his plans last night, will probably continue to serve his patrons aboard the ship hotel.

The sentiment of citizens of the seaside resort was at variance as to the action of the trustees, as each leader of the faction has his staunch supporters and it is believed that the fight will be carried into the courts.
