COUNCIL COMES TO AID OF POOR GERMAN

Disconsolate Because He Was Allowed No "Moose," Thomas Watkins Gets Ordinance Repealed and Now Is Happy

Thomas Watkins, modest and retiring, appears to exert a greater influence over the deliberations of the city council than the ablest lobbyist, who can buttonhole the city fathers and convince them that black is the purest white.

And at that Thomas Watkins is a shabby, little, sandy haired man with a German-American accent and with no favors to give away to purchase legislation for himself.

About two weeks ago Watkins set up his rocking horses and cathedral organ in the Fourth ward, where he believed he would be under the special protection of Theodore Summerland, president of the council.

Last week Watkins appeared before the council and in faltering German-American told that body that under the ordinance he could make no money and couldn't even get out of town.

When Mr. Summerland made an official call at the vacant lot where the machine had been operated he found it packed up and the little proprietor disconsolate.

Watkins appeared yesterday morning and between the two they won Councilman Healy over, and the guardian of the Eighth ward introduced a motion that the merry-go-round ordinance be repealed, which was forthwith done.

BOYHOOD FRIENDS BICKER IN A JUSTICE'S COURT

TRIAL HINDERED BY LIVELY TILT BETWEEN TWO MEN

Dignity of the Law Abused in Judge Chambers' Department During the Trial of a Case Brought Against James A. Hill by Health Officer

The dignity of the law was most unmercifully abused in Judge Chambers' court room yesterday afternoon, the occasion being the hearing of the case of J. J. O'Brien, health officer, against James A. Hill, a large and jolly fellow possessed of a keen sense of humor.
