## NEIGHBORHOOD IS TERRORIZED

### LONE WOMAN IGNORES COURT SUMMONS

### Huntington Offers Agreeable Compromise—Shakespeare Club Doings.

### Police Arrest a Burglar.

PASADENA, Oct. 21.—Police Judge Wood to-day committed Miss Joanna Fraser of Wright street to jail for five days pending an examination as to her sanity. One of Miss Fraser's neighbors obtained a warrant last night for her arrest on the charge that her chickens were doing damage to the neighbor's garden. This morning the charge was changed to that of disturbing the peace. She refused to appear in court and it took the persistence and eloquence of two officers to bring her. Much testimony was there offered to show that Miss Fraser was constantly disturbing the peace of the neighborhood in which she lives and had repeatedly threatened the lives of the neighbor women until reign of terror existed. One neighbor said that Miss Fraser could and did swear ten times harder and louder than any man and that her language was totally unfit to be heard.

#### Huntington Offers Compromise

Henry E. Huntington will construct and operate a street railway on East Orange Grove avenue within six months providing the city council will vote to abandon the franchise upon Chestnut and Summit avenues. This is the substance of a letter received by the city administration to-day from Attorney Dunn of the legal department of the Pacific Electric, and its coming indicates that the city's representations are beginning to bear fruit. Only one or two of the councilmen express themselves as unqualifiedly in favor of accepting Mr. Huntington's offer, but there seems to be little doubt that it will be ultimately accepted. It is understood that residents of Summit and Chestnut streets are no longer anxious for the car line, and that there will be little if any objection to abandoning the franchise on these streets. Property owners along East Orange Grove avenue have been agitating the matter and urging the council to insist on Mr. Huntington building upon Chestnut and Summit avenues. 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
