

WOMAN HEIR TO FORTUNE WILL TAKE BUSINESS COURSE

MRS. DOWDELL WANTS BUSINESS EDUCATION
Plans to Invest in Real Estate and Travel Extensively Through United States and Europe

In order to properly care for her windfall of \$815,000 which came to her through the death of an uncle whom she had never seen, Mrs. S. E. Dowdell will enroll herself as pupil in a good business college, and when she has learned some of the principles of high finance will invest in Los Angeles real estate.

A visit to her 18-year-old son George, whom she left in the east fourteen years ago and has not seen since, and extensive travels through the United States, to be followed by a trip abroad, are among the most alluring prospects which have become famous.

"We hardly dare to think of all that money," said Mrs. Dowdell yesterday, as a happy smile spread over her face. "It means so much to us. I must learn something of business in order to take care of it, and to do this I will enter a good business college. When I have learned how to handle money I believe I will invest in Los Angeles real estate. I now am making preparations to go east and take part in settling the estate."

"I feel especially thankful for this fortune because it will enable me to do more for my children. I can give my son, who is in college, and my daughter, who is attending an eastern art school, much better opportunities than I could without this money."

Relative of Gen. Lee
Mrs. Dowdell is a member of the Dickinson family of Massachusetts, several of whom have become famous. Her mother was Julia B. Dickinson, authoress and lecturer, who traveled over the United States on a lecture tour and three times visited Europe.

The legacy of \$815,000 was Mrs. Dowdell's portion of a fortune amounting to \$2,500,000 which was left by her uncle, L. Hilton, who died without direct heirs. When a youth he went to Colorado and engaged in mining, but never communicated with any of his relatives. His niece led his family to believe that he was dead, and the fact of his living to a ripe old age is as much of a surprise as is the immense fortune which he left.

Taft Will Not Resign
Secretary of War Announces He is Not a Candidate for Presidential Nomination

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25.—The Post tomorrow will say Secretary Taft has announced: "I have no intention of resigning from the cabinet to make a campaign for the presidency, and furthermore I have no intention whatever of making a campaign for the office of the nation's chief executive."

Secretary of War Taft is not planning to enter a campaign for the presidency, has no intention of doing so, and means to stay there as long as the president desires it. Such is the substance of an announcement made by him yesterday and which will tend to put at rest, temporarily at least, the talk of his being a presidential candidate.

MASCOT WATCH AT LAST CHANGES AND NOW IS OWNER'S HODOO

Two years ago Edward Olsson was held up and robbed of a gold watch and chain. Yesterday morning Detectives McNamara and Jones found the watch in a pawnshop conducted by Ernest Allen, and one hour later arrested Fay Jones on the charge of robbing Olsson. Jones denies having taken the watch, but circumstantial evidence points strongly to his guilt.

Since the watch left the factory it has rested in no less than ten pawnshops and traveled clear across the continent as many as four times. This was the testimony of John Risher, to whom Jones is said to have sold the watch shortly after Olsson was robbed of it. Risher said he had pawned the watch at least ten times and that he originally purchased it from Jones at Jefferson street.

After being detained in the hospital for two days Jones and Nelson suddenly left and until yesterday nothing was known by the police of the former's whereabouts.

G. A. JONES MUST ANSWER FOR EXCEEDING LIMIT

Was Driving Car That Turned Turtle on South Main Street, Injuring Himself and William Nelson

George A. Jones, owner of a big touring car which was wrecked on South Main street Tuesday evening, October 17, and who has since been wanted by the police to answer to a charge of violating the automobile ordinance, was arrested yesterday morning in San Diego by the chief of police there upon information furnished him by Capt. Auble of this city. Capt. Auble was informed of the man's presence in that city through a source which he will not divulge and immediately telephoned to the San Diego authorities. He will leave this morning for San Diego to bring Jones to this city.

At the time of the accident on South Main street in which Jones, William Nelson, the latter's brother and an unidentified woman were seriously injured, Jones was driving his car down the street at a speed said to have been far beyond the limit. In trying to evade a collision with a milk wagon coming in the opposite direction, Jones turned his car out of the road so suddenly that it upset, plunging its occupants under it. Jones and William Nelson were so badly injured that they were removed to the emergency hospital, but Nelson's brother and the woman were not hurt.
