WANT SPECIAL ELECTION ON CITY HALL SITE. NORTH MAIN STREET PROPOSITION REVIVED.

Council Considers Question of Referring Plan to People—Houghton Moves for Referendum and Hiller Promptly Second—Motion Lost

That the proposition to have the city accept the North Main street site for a city hall is not dead, nor even slumbering, was evinced by an effort made by members of the city council yesterday to have the question submitted to a special election.

Acting on this promise he yesterday moved that the clerk be instructed to advertise the special election. For probably the first time in the history of this council Councilman Hiller quickly seconded the motion.

Councilman Smith, who is chairman of the finance committee, has all along contended that the question should be submitted to a vote of the people, and has offered to give his consent to the cost of a special election.

Councilman Kern stated that he was perfectly willing that the people should vote on the question, but he was unwilling that a special election should be held for the purpose, as there are no funds in the city treasury to pay the cost.

"If the people are to vote on it the question will keep until the next general election," said Councilman Kern.
