MEDICAL MEN TESTIFY

Give Information as Result of Autopsy on Midshipman Branch's Remains

ANNAPOLIS, Nov. 28.—The autopsy held last Sunday on the body of the late Midshipman James R. Branch, Jr., bore fruit at today's session of the court martial which is trying Midshipman Minor Meriwether on charges inclusive of manslaughter in connection with the death of Midshipman Branch after a fist fight with Meriwether. The day's testimony was given chiefly by medical men, who had been present at the autopsy, and bore upon the question whether the death of Branch resulted from blows from his opponent or from his head striking the floor of the room in which the fight was held, previous testimony having shown that Branch fell or was knocked down several times during the encounter.

REICHSTAG IS OPENED BY EMPEROR WILLIAM

SPEECH DEALS MOSTLY WITH DOMESTIC AFFAIRS

Expresses Satisfaction That He Was Able to Support Successful Efforts of Mr. Roosevelt in Bringing the Great War to an End

Berlin, Nov. 28.—Emperor William opened the reichstag today at noon in the white hall of the palace, himself reading the speech from the throne. The speech was occupied chiefly with domestic affairs. Turning near the close of the speech to foreign affairs, the emperor said:

"The German empire has with all powers correct and with most of them good and friendly relations. It filled me with high satisfaction that I was able to support the successful efforts of the president of the United States in bringing about peace between his majesty, the emperor of Russia, and his majesty, the emperor of Japan. I greet Japan's entrance into the ranks of the great powers with sincere
