AMERICANS IN LONDON GATHER

THANKSGIVING OBSERVED IN BRILLIANT MANNER

Many Notable Britons Present at the Celebration—Address Made by Whitelaw Reid, United States Ambassador

By Associated Press. LONDON, Nov. 30.—Thanksgiving day was celebrated in London in the time-honored manner by leading Americans, by a banquet in the grand hall of the Hotel Cecil.

The guests of honor included Walter Vaughan Morgan, lord mayor of London, and the lady mayors; Richard E. Leineweber, solicitor general for Canada; Sir Joseph Cockfield, minister to the United States; and Sir Henry Edmund Knight.

The scene was particularly brilliant because of the presence of so many women. The band played American airs and concluded its program with "God Save the King" and the "Star Spangled Banner."

Mr. Van Duzer proposed a toast to King Edward. Mr. Leineweber, in an eloquent speech, proposed "The President of the United States." He said: "Every true American must feel it an honor to be governed by a man whose name and fame not only belong to his own country, but to humanity itself."

Lord Dimesdale proposed a toast to the American ambassador, to which Mr. Reid replied in part as follows: "Mr. Reid, in responding, first graciously welcomed the representatives of the English government, who, he said, helped to complete the reunion."
