By Associated Press. NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—The conspicuous feature of the stock market today continued to be the variety of different issues in which business was recorded, rather than the great bulk of the market.

The fluctuations in the money rate seemed to have the effect of calling attention to the fact that the 2 1/2 per cent weakened the whole market. There was no evidence of any enforced liquidation caused by the clearing up of the money outlook without sacrificing their holdings.

The release in Lead was especially violent, and New York, Chicago & St. Louis, which again led the Vanderbilt movement in the pressure to realize in the market.
