

SEE CLIMAX OF MANSFIELD'S ART

GREAT ACTOR APPEARS IN "PARISIAN ROMANCE"

Wondrous Versatility Is Shown in Number of Characters Portrayed During Past Week—Audience Held Spellbound

The "Parisian Romance" presented the climax of the Mansfield engagement last evening and in the character of Baron Chevalier the actor forced the most critical into expressions of extravagant praise. When Los Angeles sees such tremendous versatility as has been displayed by him in a range of characters including Beau Brummel, Richard III, Don Carlos and Baron Chevalier, it is understood how he came to be called America's greatest actor.

The remarkable divergence in the style of acting, the voice, the gestures, the features, by which he distinguished last evening's character from his others was nothing short of a miracle of dramatic art. So perfectly did he picture the aged "rake" of Paris that it became almost impossible to believe that off the stage he was not in reality possessed of the broken voice, bent back and faltering step that goes with dissipated old age.

Mansfield even looked thin in body as well as in face. His make-up was superb. Even his hands were so carefully disguised as to be startlingly true to the character. Every move to the smallest detail showed his skill and the infinite attention to detail upon which perhaps hangs the key to his greatness. Nothing in respect to his

character was too small to be overlooked.

"The Parisian Romance" is a charming play and held the attention of the audience absolutely through four acts, a striking contrast to the ponderous effort of the night before. The piece presents a "problem" and genuine comedy delightfully mixed.

The supporting company appeared to better advantage than in anything in which the star has given them an opportunity to show themselves. Miss Florence Rockwell really shared the honors with Mr. Mansfield. Added to her beauty and an exquisite taste in dress she is artistic to her finger tips. There shines forth in her work a spark of genius which shows unmistakably that she has not yet risen to the full measure of her greatness. Her acting imparted a sense of naturalness and the difficult role was well conceived.

Miss Adelaide Nowak also displayed wonderful art in the martyred saint's character of Baron Chevalier's wife. She possesses a personality which made the part convincing and handled the more tense scenes in a manner that won her deserved applause. Miss Eleanor Barry was excellent as the mother.

Leslie Kenyon was effective as Henri de Targy, a "straight" part with no particular opportunities. Clarence Handyside made a lifelike doctor.

SENTENCED TO MARRY

Juan Bilderrain, Accused of a Serious Crime May Escape Prison if He Weds Woman With Children

To marry a woman with two children was the punishment which Judge Smith decreed shall be the lot of Juan Bilderrain, who yesterday pleaded guilty in the superior court to a criminal offense punishable by five years or longer in the penitentiary.

Until Judge Smith has been officially notified that the sentence has been executed Bilderrain will remain a prisoner in the custody of the sheriff.

Two aspirants for the hand of the prisoner were to be considered on one side and the gates of the penitentiary stood out on the other. The judge was in a quandary, and the district attorney came to the rescue.

In company with Refugio Garcia, a Mexican girl not yet 15 years of age, the prisoner was arrested by two policemen. He was put in the county jail on a felony charge and the girl was sent to the Home of the Good Shepherd. A few days later the other woman appeared with two children of whom she claimed the prisoner was the father.

The judge finally decided that to send Bilderrain to the penitentiary would better the condition of neither woman and so ordered him to marry the woman with two children. The girl was sent back to the Home of the Good Shepherd and Judge Smith is awaiting the marriage announcement.

PHYSICIAN WILL HOLD AUTOPSY

MRS. MARY MUIR SEPULVEDA CLAIMED BY DEATH

Dr. F. O. Yost Gives Complication of Diseases as Cause, but Says He Will Make Examination of Internal Organs

Dr. F. O. Yost, the physician who attended Mrs. Sepulveda, stated last night that an autopsy would be held today. Dr. Yost says that to the best of his knowledge Mrs. Sepulveda died from a complication of diseases. However, he says he will hold an autopsy that he may determine definitely the cause of death.

Mrs. Mary R. Muir-Sepulveda, widow of John A. Muir, died yesterday morning at the family residence, Manitou avenue and Daly street, East Los Angeles, after an illness of two weeks. She was 52 years of age.

Mrs. Muir married Sepulveda about two years ago, her husband having been dead less than a year. Her second husband was younger than her oldest son. Her children disapproved of the union.

The funeral will be held from the residence Saturday at 2 p. m. Rev. J. E. Compton, pastor of the Second Presbyterian church, will officiate.


Dislike Notoriety
