ROMPS FIRST UNDER WIRE IN HANDICAP

Speedy Filly Steps Mile and One-Sixteenth in Heavy Going Within Three-Quarters of Second of Track Record

The feature event on the card at Ascot yesterday was the second \$1000 handicap of the meeting, and was won in a romp by Cutter, which stepped the one and one-sixteenth miles in the heavy going in 1:46 1/4, which is within three-quarters of a second of the track record made by Ethylene.

The performance was one of the best of the season and Cutter ran one of her best races, although she was at no time in any difficulty and the result was never for a moment in doubt.

"Puddin'" McDaniel held the mount and he hustled the Wittenberg filly to the front immediately after the start, and she never faltered during the entire journey, winning with four lengths to spare.

Banker was made favorite on suspicion and the suspicions were not well founded, as the Stokes colt seemed unable to get up to the pace of the other horses and finished in fifth position solely on suzerance.

Clydeo was always the contender, but was never good enough to catch the speedy filly, although easily winning this race from the runner-up, who was a ruse and came from seventh place in the stretch to third at the wire.

Retropaw was coupled with Cutter as the Wittenberg entry and lay in third place until he became convinced that the stable entry would cop the big end of the purse, when he ceased to worry and dropped back to seventh.

W. H. Carey was incorrigible throughout and was never better than last in the running. Banker, who closed tired under weight and ended in sixth place.

Nine Spot, the favorite, won the opening event and this feat is all the more creditable because of the fact that few favorites have accomplished the expected heretofore.

Harbor set a sizzling pace to the stretch, where Nine Spot became weary of the place and assumed the leadership. Ethylene ran into third place, beating out Quindaro by a full length.

Red Light Disqualified
Red Light, favorite, won the third race, but in doing so fouled Memories and was disqualified, giving Orchan first place, Graphite second place and Ralph Young the show money.

There was considerable crowding and bumping throughout the journey, in which Memories was usually the sufferer. With all this interference and disadvantage, the Holland mare managed to race into second place in the stretch, being a head behind Red Light, the leader.

In the final sixteenth, when Memories seemed to be winning, Red Light cut across in front of her and Jockey Davis was forced to either pull up or be thrown over into the ditch. He chose the former, his mount going back to fifth place.

There was no argument about the disqualification, as it occurred at the wire, and the judge promptly changed the number of the first three, and placed Red Light at the foot of the class.

This decision was a righteous one and was expected by the crowds in the grand stand which witnessed the fouling.

Orchan found the track to his liking and, despite his 113 pounds, had no difficulty in running into second place, thereby getting first money when Red Light was disqualified.

Graphite showed a nice turn of speed in the stretch and finished third, getting the place after the disqualification. Ralph Young was fourth and was placed third.

Orlene Wins Again
Silver Sue was made favorite to win the second race because of her light impost, but Orlene had an easy task to do for her.

The finish should be Tom Gilroy, Captain Jarrel and Silver Stealing. Orchan will probably not start in the third race, since winning the handicap yesterday is enough glory for this one.

Weyfield should be the best of the three, but Harry is the best suggestion of the day.

The probabilities are Fille d'Or, Weyfield, Gentle Harry.

No "Squatting" Today

L. A. Bonausk became dissatisfied with the manner in which his jockey, H. Moore, rode in the last race and gave him a vacation, putting up Jockey Swain yesterday. Moore will be riding again when Bonausk becomes convinced that his rider will have learned to listen to orders.

Jockey E. Walsh came out of retirement yesterday and had the mount on Fireball, which won the fifth race, having been suspended for a fortnight. When penalized Walsh was among the topnotchers and his enforced idleness caused him to slide down the ladder several notches. If he continues to ride well he did before his suspension he will soon be up among the leaders again.
