ISLAND ALTERED BY EARTHQUAKES

ITALIAN COMMUNITY GETS TWENTY-ONE SHOCKS

Utica's Surface Changed by Valley Being Formed—Volcano in Eruption—Prisoners in camp.

By Associated Press. PALERMO, March 22.—There have been twenty-one earthquake shocks on the island of Utica during the last three days. The population lives in constant terror. A great valley has been formed in the center of the island and all the houses have been demolished. The shocks were vertical, not undulatory, and were accompanied by loud subterranean rumblings.

The last shocks, which occurred yesterday, finished the work of destruction. Panic seized upon the 2000 inhabitants of the island, who abandoned their homes after the first visitation of the earthquakes and camped in the fields and public squares.
