

MINING ACTIVE IN NEW CAMPS COMPANIES SECURE SUPPLIES IN LOS ANGELES

Discovery Near Rhyolite—When Gold Boils—Plans to Boom Nevada. Placer Mining in Arizona. Activities at the El Dorado camp in Arizona are meeting with exceptional results, and all reports from that district are of the most encouraging nature.

Discovery Near Rhyolite. A remarkable change has taken place in the flow and temperature of the water at Hicker Hot Springs, an unimproved property about twelve miles north of Rhyolite, Nev., since the earthquake at San Francisco.

Waning Klondike Output. Writing of the American gold fields, the London Economist's special mining commissioner, who has been inspecting this country's resources, remarks: "The last season at Klondike was the least profitable there has been since its discovery in 1897, and its output of gold has not risen from a maximum of \$22,000,000 in 1900 to under \$5,000,000 in 1905."

When Gold Boils. Professor Henri Moissan has been trying some interesting experiments in vaporizing gold in the electric furnace. He finds that it boils at 2400 degrees centigrade, and that 100 to 150 grains can be evaporated in two or three minutes.

Will Boom Nevada. District Passenger and Traffic Agent D. S. Taggart of the Southern Pacific is arranging for the assembling of data for a book on southern Nevada's mineral resources to be published by the great transcontinental road.

Churches Near Ontario. ENGLISH MINISTERS PROTEST AGAINST ENA'S MARRIAGE. Blame the Pope for Alliance—Say Wedding of Princess to Roman Catholic is Menace to Peace of England.

LONDON, May 20.—What is calculated to create a bitter feeling between Roman Catholics and Protestants in England is the violence of the language used in the protest the other evening at the approaching marriage of Princess Ena to the king of Spain on the part of a large assembly of the clergy of the Church of England.

Alliance Is Denounced. A resolution condemning the alliance as a slight and insult to the Church of England and a danger to the British nation, was carried with vehement cheers by the audience which crowded Exeter hall.

Calamity Is Predicted. But one of the most violent speeches of the indignant clergy was that in which amid hisses and cries of shame, an excited white-haired old man said: "Princess Ena is to be pitied for receiving the blessing of the pope, and having the Order of the Golden Rose bestowed upon her. No one who ever got that blessing prospered, and it is notorious that the bestowal of the Golden Rose always followed by a calamity to the receiver."
