OCEAN GREYHOUNDS GATHER FOR RACE TO DIAMOND HEAD

SAN PEDRO HARBORS WHITE WINGS Trim-rigged Anemone Arrives at Starting Point of Transpacific Contest—Yacht Coast Club Members Predict Victory for Speedy Lurline—Boats Start Monday

After a voyage fraught with harrowing experiences as she battled with the waters about Cape Horn in an effort to reach the western coast for the great Honolulu yacht race, the Anemone arrived yesterday at San Pedro...

The Anemone experienced considerable difficulty in reaching the coast, as she was out 144 days from New York and traveled a distance of 16,000 miles, or two-thirds the entire distance around the world...

Upon reaching San Diego several weeks ago it was first thought that the Anemone would be withdrawn, but this intention on the part of her owner was reconsidered and she was immediately put on the ways to be repaired...

The Anemone is a beautiful little vessel and the largest of the fleet to enter the race. She is ketch rigged and has a length of 91 feet at water line and 112 feet over all with a 20-foot beam...

She carries a crew of eleven men all told and will have on board one or two passengers, friends of the owner, one of whom is Prof. L. A. E. Ahlers of the Colorado college at Colorado Springs...

When the Anemone goes over the line Monday morning, off the breakwater at San Pedro, she will have to contend with one of the fastest and reatest designed crafts on the coast, the Lurline, which is the flag boat of the South Coast Yacht club...

The Lurline is owned by Commodore Sinclair, who is a prominent member of the South Coast Yacht club. Mr. Sinclair considers her chances of the best and sees no reason why his craft should not come in a day ahead of her nearest competitor...
