SAN PEDRO DRAWS UP STRINGENT SALOON LAWS RAISES LICENSE, CUTS OUT MUSIC AND WINE ROOMS

Side Entrances, Rear Signs and Dumb Waiters Abolished by Board of Trustees—Even the Territory is Restricted

SAN PEDRO, June 14.—Restrictions placed on the saloons by the board of trustees in special session last night are the most stringent ever drafted in San Pedro and the saloon men are putting up quite a protest over them.

It is expressly stated that there shall be no wine rooms in the saloon or rooms of a similar character, neither shall there be dumb waiters allowed nor stairways in the rooms to chambers above.

THE territory in which all saloons must do business is restricted to Front street between Fourth and Sixth streets and if an owner wishes to sell to another party he must pay to the city \$500 for the privilege of having his license changed.

DRUGGISTS are required to pay a license of \$2 per month while in the past they have not been obliged to pay anything.
