DISPUTE OVER PENNIES RESULTS IN CRIME

Coroner's Jury Returns Verdict Charging Samuel Cannalla, the Italian, With Shooting His Wife to Death

"Mary Cannalla met her death by a gunshot, fired with the intent of killing, by her husband, Samuel Cannalla."

Such is the verdict rendered by the jury at the inquest held yesterday over the body of the woman who was so brutally murdered Monday night at 807 Catalina street.

Story of the Murder At the time the first two shots were fired, both of them directed at the woman, A. Gallo was in the kitchen by himself. In the room with Cannalla and his wife were Mrs. Gallo and little Alice Cannalla.

Dying Woman's Statement Yesterday Cannalla declared that he did not do the shooting, but that it was done by A. Gallo, his father-in-law. His wife, though, just before she died at the receiving hospital Monday night, said her husband fired the shots.
