Then it passes to the forms of what we call the intelligent animals. But however intelligent-looking may be an animal, such as the monkey, the first three principles of life are not open in them.

Evolution Long Process

"From a savage man to be evolved into a civilized man is a long process involving the absorption of the magnetism of well-regulated and refined mentalities. The savage man's mentality partakes more of the animal's instincts and proclivities. But when in civilized human family, the basic principle of life called soul—the part of the all-pervading God in man—is on the verge of being opened.

All Depends on Mind

"The human mind is the playground of the animal and the divine. When the animal instincts preponderate in man he has not realized his manhood. When the divine instincts preponderate, through thinking on the divine, then only man cognizes his manhood. For perfect manhood is divinity itself. This is meant when it is said that God has made man in his own image. So long as man occupies his mind with the pleasures and objects of the senses, so long he is an animal. The divine in him is there all the same, but his mind not being conscious of it he fails to be even human, though possessing human shape.

At the First Christian church yesterday morning Rev. A. C. Smither preached on "Christ Formed in Us." He said in part:

The most marvelous fact in human experience is the incarnation of God in the person of Jesus Christ. The matches story in the whole realm of human history. How we marvel at the story of the nativity. God came into human flesh through the birth and development of the Son of God. It was a birth apart from and above the ordinary processes of human generation. It was in accord with the high character, the miraculous powers of God. What are God's methods of working in and through Christ are miracles to us? "As God came into human flesh through the birth and development of the Son of God, so Christ came into the nature of the human heart by birth, a birth of the water and the Spirit. The Holy Spirit begets new life in us through and by means of the word of God. The birth is completed in Christian baptism, the mode which is beautifully symbolized in birth, which also symbolizes the changed relationship brought about by this ordinance of the church. Jesus declares, 'Except man be born of water and the Spirit he can not enter into the kingdom of God.'"

"Resulting from this spiritual birth comes a spiritual nature. The child shares the nature of the parent. So the Christian, as a result of this birth, becomes a partaker of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through the nature of the Christ forming in him. His ideas are formed by divine ideals. His whole tenor of his life is based upon divine standards. He has the infinite depth and thrill in his heart is attuned to the music of the eternal. This informing of Christ is produced by growth and development even as Jesus grew in wisdom and stature. The processes of spiritual development must accord with its value. In him was found no flaw. No out and perfected in an hour that it may perish in a day. It grows by feeding upon the everlasting truths of the divine kingdom, by activities in the spiritual realm, by fellowship with other kindred spirits and with the Almighty. Jesus never ever had an ideal and the incentive in such growth. This forming of Christ in us must be done with an adequate comprehension of the character of Christ. He was the perfect manifestation of the Almighty. In him was found no flaw. No stain was upon his character. He was the perfect exemplification of the divine character. No man can grow into the full likeness of Christ who does not see in him the perfect image and likeness to the Father. His life must be surrendered, completely imaged after his Father.

"The Christian must catch the great underlying purposes of the Christ life. His mission was to seek and to save the lost, was not to be ministered unto but to serve and give his life as a ransom for the sins of the world. This great work is committed to the hands of his church. His followers are to share these sublime purposes and execute them among men. Surely to save this world from the evils of sin and a task sufficiently great for his followers. No man is a true disciple of the Lord who does not share in his work and bear on his heart a part of the burden of the Christ.

"Christ formed in Christians brings them to the arena and fulfills life possible to man. Under the loving touch of Christ man is brought into harmony with God, is properly related to his fellow men and has his own powers harmonized and thus he enters into the largest liberty, the supreme joy of living. The man who would attain to the highest joy of living must follow in the footsteps of the Master, must be fashioned after the likeness of Christ."

FEELS TO BE A REJOICING FOR DEVELOPMENT

FINDS CAUSE FOR REJOICING IN GEOGRAPHY

Rev. Frank DeWitt Talmage Reviews Blessings That Have Come to Nation Since Day Was Set Aside

In his Thanksgiving sermon, Rev. Frank DeWitt Talmage reviewed the many causes which ought to inspire a nation's gratitude and arouse its patriotism. The text was Deut. 8:10. Marvelous, wonderful, indescribable are the atmospheric conditions of the great southwest of our republic.

"And what a health resort we have! Our leading men of the west have, for the most part, been the great leaders of the nation. They have broken down the eastern homes, they have broken down physically and have had to seek a warmer climate. Or they have gone to Southern California or the great southwest, because there is sickness in the family. Rather than be separated from their loved ones, they have gone to the southwest to renew their life's struggles near to the Pacific coast. The result is, that some of the ablest ministers and lawyers and physicians and engineers and educators and financiers and men of all departments of life have settled in the great southwest. The successful man of New York will not change his home to become the successful man of Chicago, nor will the successful man of Chicago move to St. Louis to start life anew. The man who has a business here, he has become anchored with a thousand roots. The human tree cannot, without much ripping and tearing and breaking, be torn away from its home-land. But when consumption taps a man's lungs, or asthma chokes his breathing, or his beloved wife or son or daughter is afflicted, and the call comes to the invalid, 'come to California, come to New Mexico, come to Arizona or Texas,' the physician will look his office and the minister leave his parish pulpit, and the merchant close up his ledger and start out to find a new home in the great southwest. And it is through this means that some of the ablest men of our republic have gone south and west to build up our magnificent industrial empire. They cannot you thank God for the development of our great southwest, which came to us in the remarkable way it did."

But, alas, now with flushed cheek of humiliation and downcast eyes of shame, we must recall our national dealings with the poor, helpless, struggling republic of Mexico, in reference to the Texan annexation of 1845, and the Mexican cession of 1848, and the more we study this sad episode of our national history the more we feel that our government not only acted unjustly, but she acted dishonestly.

"In the first place, to understand the chief cause of this geographical expansion you must enter the United States senate at Washington and stand for a little while there amid the slavery agitations of ante-bellum time of the early forties. The north was arraying its congressional forces on the one hand against the south, and the other hand, the great center of this foreign struggle was in the United States senate. 'We must have more men to represent us in the senate,' cried the north. Then, as speedily as possible, they rushed the westward to fill up the prairies beyond and financiers and men of all states to send their senators to the national capital to help them in the slavery fight. 'We must have more men in the United States senate to help us in the struggle to perpetuate slavery,' cried the south. But where were they to get the new senators? There was no possible new states south of the Mason and Dixon line. So the south turned its eyes toward Texas, a part of the Mexican republic. It practically said, 'If the Mexican republic will not sell Texas we will send the settlers of the United States into it, and we will get up a revolution there and then we will annex it to the United States, and out of Texas can be carved new states. In other words, the south overran Texas with its people, the north rushed its settlers in Kansas territory a little later in order to make it an abolition state. Then, after Texas was admitted to the Union, the United States government, figuratively speaking, as a highwayman, put the pistol to Mexico's forehead and said, 'Surrender to me all of California, all of Nevada, all of Arizona and most of New Mexico for a paltry \$15,000,000 or I will blow your brains out and gobble up the whole country.' Of course, I am telling you a transaction in a coarse way, but I am truthfully, though bluntly, telling you what the United States government did. I am recounting bare historical facts. Not as a just sister nation did the United States act toward Mexico. From one stroke of the sword of war our government split the Mexican republic in half and stole the best part of her lands. She took this land as a conqueror. She took it because her armies were stronger than Mexico's and she took the land in no other way. That land steal was done both by the north and the south.

"But, as England acted unjustly in absorbing the Transvaal and the Orange Free State; yet, after all, the greatest wrong done to the British flag goes the British flag goes. Where the British flag goes, there goes the British capital and British men and Anglo-Saxon enterprise. Because the British flag now waves over all the southern territory of Africa, there is going to grow up a great African government which shall rival the Australian government, and make those hills teem with enterprise and with virile life. Because the Stars and the Stripes wave over Texas and New Mexico and Arizona and Nevada and California, those lands have been developed as they never could or would have been under Mexican rule. With all the advantages of climate which these states have, and with their great mineral and agricultural possibilities, Texas and Arizona and New Mexico and Nevada and California would not be supporting the vast numbers of prosperous homes were it not for American rule and the protection of the United States flag.

"In praying for the climatic conditions of the great southwest and especially touch of Christ man, we may use the strongest superlatives. We must combine in that description of California's climate the invigorating of the temperate zone and the balminess of the tropics. We must describe a climate beneficial to the well man and for the sick. In this Edenic climatic condition, we find all the atmospheric blessings of the Arctic cuddling up and nestling against all the atmospheric blessings of the tropics. We must describe a climate, like an Alpine avalanche of snow, threaten to destroy the Norwegians and the Russians and the Greenlanders; free, too, from the pestiferous miasms of the equator, which, like the fatal coils of the Brazilian anaconda, threaten to crush out the life of the inhabitants. Here, truly, the crocus and the heliotrope can grow all the year around. As loving maidens, they lift up their lips to be wooed and kissed by the same gentle sun.

"Are the climatic conditions of Southern California—all that?" says some one. 'You are talking like a

crazy man. How can winter and summer be married at the same nuptial shrine?' How, I do not know. The meteorologists tell me that the cause is due to the Japan current which flows like a great river along the shore of California. But, after that scientific explanation has been given me a rational explanation for this atmospheric elysium. I am as much in the dark as ever. I simply state facts as they are, and must refer you to the scientists for the causes.

"I know that on December 23, 1903, I left Chicago in a blinding snowstorm, to go and live in Los Angeles. Buried up in a heavy fur-lined overcoat, the wind cut through me like a knife. Yet, strange to say, after I arrived in Los Angeles, I could look out of my study window into my yard, and see roses growing upon the bushes. These roses were not protected by hot house glass, but were breathing the same fresh air that I breathed. Winter and summer impossible to be married? You can see that at my study window every day of your life in Southern California. There the Januaries and Februaries are not any more wonderful than the Julys and Augusts. There the inhabitants must sleep under their blankets all the year around. Marvelous, wonderful, indescribable are the atmospheric conditions of the great southwest of our republic.

"The thought of judgment day should be to those who are striving to live according to God, a source of hope and trust in God's mercy. It should fill them with confidence and aid them in overcoming all the obstacles of the way of salvation. But they who persistently violate God's law have great reason to fear the avenging justice of the Almighty. They should by sincere repentance ask pardon for their sins while there is time. Let death find them in their sins and God's justice condemn them to eternal punishment."
