

SHAYS OFFICIAL CONTRACTOR SCORES ENGINEER FOR REPORT

Colonel Fox Reads a Scathing Letter to the Board of Public Works.

Will Try to Defeat Amendments

Colonel E. R. Fox, in regard to whom the impression exists at the city hall that he is the representative of Stansbury & Powell, contractors, appeared before the board of public works yesterday morning. He desired to impress upon the members that the city engineer was guilty of atrocious fraud, but the somewhat heated utterances of the colonel failed to produce the desired effect.

Plaint of Colonel Fox was to the effect that after the board of public works advertised for bids for the construction of the sewer from the fall sewer they had no right to reject the bids and proceed with the building themselves.

The board had previously been given an opinion by the city attorney which greatly conflicted with the contention of Colonel Fox, and on the basis of that opinion the board was not disposed to regard Colonel Fox's statement seriously.

The communication read by Colonel Fox to the board of public works was as follows. Fox asked that the document be filed, but the board decided not to do so:

Says He's Not a Squealer

"To the Board of Public Works: "Not being a squealer when fairly beaten on a contract, I desire to enter a protest against your late action in the matter of the outfall sewer.

"I desire to call your attention to the fact and have it placed on record for future reference that the report of your engineer, recently submitted, was entirely false and misleading. I offered to complete the section called for for \$265,000. I did not require the use of a single foot of lumber to be paid for by the city. Your engineer's insertion of the lumber or timber clause was in the interest of graft, pure and simple. The fact is that there is no possibility of using lumber in the tunnel under a proper or modern method of construction.

Placing the figure of \$12.50 per thousand feet for lumber which costs at the yard today \$22.50, with \$3 for hauling, is absurd on its face. This I know at a glance to be graft, as the city has been furnishing the lumber free to the contractor and paying \$12.50 for putting it in. The contract did not, however, say so, and as I was not on the inside I did not care to put myself in the position of being swamped by any adverse action of the engineer ordering an unlimited quantity of timber which I did not require at a loss of \$22.50 per thousand.

"Further, the character of the report is evidenced by the estimate of 1,300,000 feet of lumber required. Stansbury & Powell timbered some 1000 or 2000 feet of tunnel of the same identical character with 100 feet to the foot. As there are but 6300 feet to cut yet, would you require that \$20,000 be expended in the present methods instead of 1,800,000, an overestimate of 100 per cent, a waste of over \$50,000, according to your engineer's figures, as I would not have used a foot of lumber?

"I say now, as I have said before, that you haven't in your employ any man, engineer or otherwise, who can complete that section for \$350,000, cement and bricks being supplied, as with me, to complete it within a year and a half. No competent engineer would saw out a door opening to fit in a stoppage hole, and that is exactly what they are now doing.

"I am calling your attention to these conditions in that they will be recalled later in a responsibility for the loss of the people's money, and entirely eliminating any possibility of any recovery from Stansbury & Powell.

"Also, let me recall to your attention the fact that I offered to accompany you to the tunnel on your visit which preceded the abandonment of the work by Stansbury & Powell, and without charge, to show Stansbury & Powell how to complete the work economically, which I offered to do before you made a suggestion to pay their labor account, but nothing to themselves. This you declined, and the day after your visit the work on the tunnel was abandoned.

"I throw the responsibility for this condition upon yourselves, notwithstanding the aspersion and mendacious report made by your engineer. While it is universally conceded that all of you are strictly honest, the conclusion goes to the effect that I think I can convince the voters that it is the best policy to vote down the amendments that place it in your power to fool away in the same manner the thirty millions for the Owens river which I fear if not checked I can help convince them to fall on the vote for the bond issue. E. R. FOX."

REMAINS IN THE FEDERATION

Friday Morning Club Takes Decisive Action on a Subject That Has Been Agitated

Trask all gave interesting talks on the subject at issue, and among the reasons they gave for remaining in the federation were the widened scope it gave the club women, the example the Friday Morning club, as such a large organization, would set to the other clubs, and that it helped every woman in every way.

The building committee reported that nearly all the money needed for the lot had been raised, and it was also decided to take out a membership in the juvenile court.

FIRE COMMISSION GRANTS PERMITS

Several Requests for Installation of Engines and Steam Boilers at Various Points Favorably Considered

The permits issued by the fire commission yesterday were as follows: Carse & Co. were given permission to install a gasoline engine at 769 San Fernando street. The engine to be used to operate a machine shop and brass foundry.

W. G. Cogswell was given a permit to erect and maintain a steam boiler at 536 Potter park avenue.

The application of A. H. Hess to change the location of his planing mill from 125 West Avenue 56 to Piedmont avenue between Avenues 53 and 60 was held over one week. A delegation of the residents of the section in which the planing mill is located appeared to protest against its relocation in that neighborhood for the reason that it is strictly a residence section of the city.

Hess was originally granted a permit to operate a small power gasoline engine for the purpose of finishing small work that he used to do as carpenter. Instead of installing the engine that he had specified Hess is alleged to have put in a twenty-five horse-power machine and to have done commercial work with it.

Mayor McAdams has said Hess' permit from being revoked whenever the latter has appeared before the board of fire commissioners. He will have another hearing next week and in the meantime he will endeavor to find a location in a business or manufacturing section of the city where the protest against the existence of his planing mill will not be so strong.

The Franco-American Baking company was given a permit to install a steam boiler at 838-46 Castelar street.

G. W. Welfenbach was allowed to install an electric motor for a marble works at 165 West Thirty-fifth street.

The Dixie Biscuit company was given a permit to install a steam boiler at 709 South Los Angeles street.

In order for the Western Rubber company to operate a vulcanizing plant it was necessary for it to have a steam boiler. The permit for the installation of the boiler was secured from the fire commissioners. The plant will be located at 1010 South Main street.

The Home Telephone company was allowed to install a steam boiler for a heating plant at 718 South Olive street. The Niles Pease company was permitted to do the same at 640 South Hill and the Hague Domestic Oil Burner company was issued a permit to install an oil storage tank at 838 Castelar street.

JUSTICE TEMPERED FOR BOY

Youth Pleads Guilty to His First Theft and is Placed on Probation

Ralph C. Ormiston, 15 years of age, pleaded guilty to the crime of petty larceny before Justice Chambers yesterday, but he was allowed to go in the custody of his father.

The boy was charged with larceny of a diamond ring valued at \$65 from the jewelry store of Brock & Feagans, Fourth and Broadway, several weeks ago.

"I stole the ring and had the stone removed and set in a pin and then sold it for \$12," Ormiston said. "I needed the money to pay some debts I owed and was afraid to tell my father and ask him for the money. I have been working in factories in the city and this is the first time I ever stole anything."

As it was the first time he had ever been arrested the prosecuting attorney asked that the case against him be dismissed and he was allowed to go until March 3, when he will again be called before the court and made to give an account of his actions between now and that date.
