An autopsy has not yet been performed, but it is presumed that Beck's neck or back was broken either by striking his head on the hub or else when the wheel passed over his body.

LONG BEACH, Feb. 20.—There promises to be a large attendance at the mass meeting in the tabernacle, Third street and Locust avenue, Monday night, when a vote will be taken as to whether it is wise to call an election on the question of a \$300,000 bond issue for a new high school building.

At a meeting held two weeks ago and attended by about 100 citizens a resolution was adopted asking the board of school trustees to call such an election.

Since that time, however, many have expressed the opinion that it would be unwise to submit such a proposition at this time.

There are many other matters of civic advancement and improvement which must be attended to in the near future, and if it is decided that any issue of bonds to alleviate the present crowded condition of the schools is advisable it is likely that only a small amount will be voted on.


