


GOLD, SILVER AND LEAD

PIANO FACTORY IS IN OPERATION

NOTABLE ADDITION TO LOS ANGELES INDUSTRIES

Concern Constructs a Three-Story Building and Begins Work of Turning Out Instruments Made by Expert of Great Repute

The growth of Los Angeles as an industrial center has been most marked during the past year.

Possibly the most notable acquisition is the latest one and which has come into existence practically without the knowledge of the general public.

Los Angeles now is the home of the largest piano manufacturing plant on the coast, and with the concern is connected the name of probably the best known of the old-time surviving piano makers—Charles Baumeister, who established the Baumeister Piano company, whose instruments have a world-wide reputation.

Mr. Baumeister recently came to Los Angeles on a visit, and was so charmed with the Angel City and Southern Cal-

ifornia that he decided to locate here permanently.

He disposed of his interests in New York, and with A. M. Salyer and his sons of the Pacific Music company, which has handled the Baumeister piano on the coast, organized the Salyer-Baumeister company, with a capital stock of \$100,000.

The company purchased a site at Alhambra and Sichel streets, in East Los Angeles, on which was erected a three-story plant, which now has in process of manufacture nearly a hundred pianos, which will constitute the first output.

As far as possible the plant will utilize the products of California factories in its pianos, including soundingboards, which are manufactured in Los Angeles for a number of lending piano factories; felt hammers, which are made at Dolgeville, the product of which factory is used in piano making more extensively than that of any other single felt factory; the plates, which are cast by one of the leading foundries, while the cases are made under the supervision of Victor Wolmer, for many years connected with the Vose Sons and the Chickering.

For actions, the company will use those made by Wessel, Nickell & Gross, and by Schwander, whose products are recognized as world standards.

All the work will be under the supervision of Mr. Baumeister, who has an international reputation as a scientific scale drawer, pattern maker and tone regulator.

Mr. Baumeister was given a reception one evening during the past week in the parlor of the Pacific Music company, and at which several hundred purchasers of his pianos were present.

The guest made a brief speech in which he said that Los Angeles was regarded in the east as the musical and art center of the Pacific coast.






