

### S. P. TRAIN IN DITCH; TWO DEAD

#### SUNSET EXPRESS DERAILED ON COAST LINE

Engineer and Man Who Was Stealing Ride Killed, Firemen Severely Hurt—Passengers Escape Without Injuries

By Associated Press. BRADLEY, Cal., May 29.—Southern Pacific passenger train No. 10, known as the Sunset Express, which left San Francisco at 8 o'clock Tuesday night, was derailed three miles east of Bradley early this morning.

The train, consisting of seven Pullmans and a baggage car, was running at the rate of 35 miles an hour at the time of the accident. That there was no loss of life among the passengers is due to the fact that none of the Pullmans turned over, although five of them left the track.

Engineer James Bybee and a man who was stealing a ride were instantly killed. The fireman was badly scalded, but some hope is entertained for his recovery.

Upon further investigation it developed that the supposed tramp who was killed in the wreck was Milton Henry, a striking railway workman of 206 Twenty-third street, San Francisco.

With three companions, Milton was on his way to Los Angeles. In his possession was found a bank book showing \$250 standing in his credit in a San Francisco bank. His original home is believed to have been Houston, Tex.

REDDING, May 29.—Trestle No. 13, on the Southern Pacific north of Hornbrook, Siskiyou county, caught fire from sparks of the engine on passenger train No. 13 at 6 o'clock this morning and was almost totally destroyed.

### QUEEN NEAR DEATH IN BAD RUNAWAY

#### WIFE OF NORWAY'S KING HAS NARROW ESCAPE

As the carriage was crossing a bridge over Lake Marne, one of the horses commenced plunging furiously.

The water under the bridge is not deep, and the dragons pulled out the horses. One of the animals was killed. Foreign Minister Pinchon gave a dinner at the foreign office tonight in honor of the visiting sovereigns.

### PACIFIC ROAD TO SPEND MILLIONS

#### SIERRA MADRE SYSTEM TO INCREASE MILEAGE

Company Has Bought Rio Grande & Pacific and Will Extend Line to the Gulf of California

By Associated Press. EL PASO, Tex., May 28.—President H. R. Nickerson, George D. Cook and E. J. Gates of the executive committee of the Sierra Madre & Pacific railroad decided today on increased mileage costing \$15,000,000 to \$20,000,000. The company has purchased the Rio Grande & Pacific with its branches from Juarez to Casas Grandes, and from Guzman to San Pedro on the Cananea, Yaqui River.

### IRISH COUNCIL BILL DISCUSSED

Premier Likely to Perform Last Rites Over Unhappy Measure on June 3—Much Criticism Expressed

LONDON, May 29.—The situation resulting from the rejection of Mr. Birrell's Irish council bill by the Dublin convention continues to be the uppermost topic of discussion in political circles in the United Kingdom. As forecasted the measure is in its death throes, and it is believed that as a result of the prolonged cabinet meeting today Premier Campbell-Bannerman will formally perform the obsequies on June 3.

DANCE PATRONS REFUSE TO JIG WITH SAILORS. NORFOLK, Va., May 29.—Replying to the official cognizance taken by the navy department of the exclusion of the enlisted men in uniform from the dancing pavilion at the Pine Beach resort adjoining the Jamestown exposition grounds the management of the pavilion today said that in excluding enlisted men in uniform it had no idea of discriminating against the service uniform, but that owing to the public prejudice against close association with the uniform the patrons of the dancing pavilion had declared they would withdraw if sailors were permitted on the floor.

### BATTLESHIP'S TOPMAST FALLS; TWO INJURED

NORFOLK, Va., May 29.—The topmast of the battleship Virginia fell during the drill hour this morning, striking one of the fighting tops, injuring Boatswain's Mate Griffin seriously and Seaman Kinley, Griffin is internally injured and probably will die. The accident was caused by the breaking of a "fid pin" that holds the wooden topmast in position. An investigation has been ordered.


