



NO DEMAND FOR STOCKS

TRADING DEAD ON NEW YORK EXCHANGE

OPERATIONS ARE CONFINED TO SMALL DEALS

Standard Oil Fine Discussed—Attempt Made to Discount Unfavorable Bank Statement—London Holiday Affects Market

By Associated Press. NEW YORK, Aug. 3.—Today's stock market was wholly inconsequential and was an affair of a few room traders who exchanged operations among themselves. The net result was next to nothing.

Only a few stocks were dealt in at all, the body of the list being wholly neglected. The drop of prices was as much due to inattention as to any other active cause.

The loan expansion also was moderate, so that the decrease in the surplus was limited to \$1,785,475, bringing it down to \$7,474,400, compared with \$14,122,575 on this date last year.

The holiday in London and its continuance over Monday was a factor in the extreme dullness of the market, which was unrelieved to the closing, when stagnation conditions prevailed.

Later came reports of colder weather in the northwest. Commission houses commenced to buy moderately. The buying increased and finally reports of frost in Michigan and Minnesota and the Dakotas caused the market to become strong and active.

The corn market was active and strong for the greater part of the day. The market closed firm. September wheat opened 1/4¢ higher there, at 91 1/2¢; sold between 91 1/2¢ and 92¢ and closed at 92 1/2¢.

The oats market was exceedingly active throughout the session. The big firms who have been buying for several days were again in the market and in addition there was frantic buying by shorts who were anxious to cover. The bulls sold on the bulges, but failed to weaken the market. The close was strong. September oats opened 1/4¢ higher at 42 1/2¢; sold between 42 1/2¢ and 43¢ and closed at the latter figure.

Provisions were dull. September pork closed unchanged. Ribs were 5¢ higher and lard was 1¢ higher.

GROWERS NOW FAVOR FRUIT CURING LAW

The Sonoma County Pomona grange has gone on record against any effort to change the department ruling on the use of sulphur in drying and curing fruits. The Pomona grange is composed of members from all granges in the county and is a representative body of fruit growers. The discussion was brought about by the receipt of a request that the grange adopt resolutions favoring a change from the recent ruling which would permit the use of a greater quantity of sulphur in handling dried fruit. It was the sentiment of the grange that sulphur was injurious if used in large quantities and was of value only in bleaching fruit. This bleaching, they claimed, instead of adding to the quality, actually detracted therefrom. It was argued that by strict compliance with the law the demand for bleached fruit would be destroyed with and the natural fruit would become acceptable to buyers.
