ROCKEFELLER SYMBOLIZES MODERN CIVILIZATION World is Working Out Problems in Domain of Commerce, Says Reynold E. Blight to Los Angeles Fellowship

Reynold E. Blight, associate minister of the Los Angeles Fellowship, spoke in Blanchard hall yesterday on the subject, "Is Commercialism a Blessing or a Curse?" He said in part: "History is a magnificent and instructive pageant. Each epoch could well be represented by a symbolical figure, the type of moral excellence produced by the age."

Blessings of Trade "It is a distorted view of our present age that sees only the wrongs under which the people suffer, and wholly forgets the good which is done because certain abuses exist. It is true that mighty monopolies are robbing the people, that graft taints our government, that corporate industries flourish on rebates, that skepticism blights the mind of our youth, and that many black spots stand out large upon our industrial and social life, but these evils are more than outweighed by the blessings that commercialism has given to the race."

SHRINERS INITIATE CLASS OF CANDIDATES

FOUR SCORE JOIN TEMPLE OF AL MALAIKAH Dutch Supper Served While Vaudevillians Entertain—Purse Collected for Woman Who Aided Victims of Wreck

The Shriners' new temple at Jefferson and Royal streets was ablaze with light and filled with merry sounds Saturday night and until an early hour yesterday morning, the occasion being the initiation of nearly four score candidates into Al Malaiakah temple.

Following the initiation ceremonies a real, first class dinner was served. During and after the supper the Shriners were entertained by vaudeville sketches by professionals secured for the occasion by Noble John H. Blackwood, manager of the Belasco theater.
