Aunt Aggie was easily better than the field of ten opposed to her. Away from the post in sixth position, she was headed by Calera, Annie Wells and Miniature.

It was a procession all the way, save that Blue Bottle ran in third position for a quarter and then allowed Kirkfield Belle to have the honor for the next furlong.

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Louise Fitzgibbon and Lady Kitty were the fortunate ones at the start and went out in the lead for half a mile.
