TELLS OF MISSION WORK WITH GAMBLERS

The Rev. H. Russell Graves of Los Angeles Has Interesting Experiences in Goldfield Faro Den

Interesting stories of frontier mission work are told by Rev. H. Russell Graves, missionary of the Southern California Baptist convention, with headquarters in Los Angeles.

"I and Goldfield and that country around there one of the newest of the new sections when it comes to methods of missionary work," said Rev. Mr. Graves, speaking of his work yesterday.

"When you come to a town where gambling is wide open, where you have to step up to the bar in order to register at the hotel, you must not try the old methods. They want the good old-fashioned gospel direct."

"I was traveling to Goldfield on the train when the conductor spoke to a crowd of men who had been drinking rather heavily and carousing in the next car, telling them that they had better be a little more quiet, since there was a preacher on the train. One of them began to declare most emphatically that he didn't care. But that man became interested in my work, however, when I talked to him about it."

"Then there was a man who used to be interested in the church and had almost become converted. Somehow he got sidetracked and was keeping a big gambling institution there when he called to see him. I first met his wife and she told me she felt sure I could do something with him. I accordingly went into his establishment, found him, introduced myself and
