MERE CHANCE FRUSTRATES THE DASTARDLY DESIGN Chancellor of Arch-Diocese Tells of Plan to Slay Father Renuzolo Brewed by Anti-Clerical Society

By Associated Press. CHICAGO, Feb. 27.—A plot to murder a priest at the altar of his church—just as Father Leo Heinrich of Denver was slain—was hatched in Chicago and frustrated almost by chance, according to the Rev. Father E. M. Dunne, chancellor of the archdiocese.

This information was given out by Father Dunne yesterday to prove further his contention that the murder in St. Elizabeth's church in Denver was planned by anarchistic anti-clericals in Chicago.

The murder in Denver was similar in every respect to the one planned several months ago in which the Rev. Father Pasquale Renuzolo, pastor of St. Roch's church at Chicago Heights, was to have been the victim.
