

**PROFESSOR TALKS OF PERFECT HUMAN BEINGS**

Students of Polytechnic High School Listen to Address on "Hundred Per Cent Men and Women"

Prof. F. F. Bunker, assistant superintendent of Los Angeles public schools, addressed the students of the Polytechnic high school yesterday in their auditorium.

The subject of Mr. Bunker's talk was the "Hundred Per Cent Man and Woman." He kept the students full of mirth with his many witticisms and yet impressed upon them the seriousness of the subject with which he was dealing.

Following Mr. Bunker, Principal Francis took the platform and announced the lecture on "Wireless Telegraphy," which was to be given by Professor Harry L. V. Twining, instructor of electrical engineering in the school, and which was postponed three weeks on account of a breakdown of the apparatus which was to be used in illustrating the lecture, will be given Friday evening in the Polytechnic auditorium.

**HIBERNIANS BANQUET AND CHEER TOASTS**

ADDRESS BY RT. REV. THOMAS J. CONATY

SUGGESTION OF RE-ELECTION OF ROOSEVELT APPLAUDED

Reference Made to Warships in the Pacific—Mayor Harper Praises Los Angeles Public Schools for Efficiency

With patriotic toasts and hearty cheers for Irish aims, a St. Patrick's day banquet took place at Levy's cafe last evening under the auspices of the Ancient Order of Hibernians. A feature of the occasion was a scholarly address by Rt. Rev. Thomas J. Conaty, D. D., who responded to the toast, "The Day We Celebrate." An interesting incident was the applause given a declaration concerning President Roosevelt and re-election, made by Senator H. W. Savage, who spoke to the toast, "The President of the United States." Introduced as the "sage of San Pedro," Senator Savage said when about to conclude his speech:

"I hope—and I know that you agree with me—that Theodore Roosevelt, our beloved president, may be spared to be again nominated and re-elected president of the United States."

The statement was applauded with notable vigor, and was the declaration by Senator Savage that President Roosevelt "has quieted Japan by sending the battleships from the Atlantic to the Pacific, thereby confirming the old adage that 'an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.'"

At the suggestion of the toastmaster, John W. Carrigan, three hearty cheers were given for President Roosevelt. In responding to the toast, Mayor C. Harper declared that Los Angeles has no "knockers," that every citizen is a "booster." He praised the public school system of Los Angeles for its efficiency, and paid high tribute to the old Roman, Joseph Scott" of the board of education.

**Banqueters Welcomed**  
The opening address was made by D. F. McLaughlin, chairman, who, "as president of division 1 of the grandest and best organization on earth," welcomed the banqueters and introduced the toastmaster. **Bishop Conaty's Address**  
In answering the toast, "The Day We Celebrate," Bishop Conaty presented to us one of the world's noblest characters as well as one of religion's greatest successes. It commemorates the life and deeds of a chosen apostle of Christianity who with the message of good tidings led an entire race out of the darkness of paganism into the full light of the highest and truest knowledge. As a character he has been famed for unselfishness, courage, sacrifice, duty. A stranger in blood and in national instincts, he gave to the world a religion which was sent as a missionary a long life of unstinted service in obedience to the religious mission which had been imposed upon him. Greatness, as he himself has said, is not in wealth nor in world conquests, but in Godlike goodness which leads a man to spend himself that others may be saved and know the truth. St. Patrick, the apostolic, self-sacrificing, unselfish missionary of the truth and of goodness, belongs to all men. He is one of the noblest and one of the most of humanity's noble sons, one of life's highest inspirations.

**A Day of Double Joy**  
"St. Patrick's day for us brings the double joy of religion and motherland symbolized in the cross of Christ and the shamrock of our country. On a day like this we may be permitted to indulge in the pride of tracing our Christian lineage across fifteen centuries of vicissitudes, of triumphs and defeats, of joys and sorrows in the native land and in the adopted lands. We may be permitted to boast of the record, the fame, and the character of the Irish people, and glorify in the fact that a stronger Christian power was needed to prevent disorder and chaos in national life.

**The Irish in America**  
"To no nation does Ireland owe more than to America, and to no nation has Ireland given more loyal service. This republic has given to our people a home and a citizenship which invests them with all the privileges of freemen. The republic has received in return the loyal devotion of their Irish lives and its days of danger the red blood of their soldierly hearts. We never can forget the strong words of the late Senator Hoar, who, when speaking of the Irish relation to America, said, 'The Irish brought a dowry to this marriage which the centuries are to weld the great traits of the great races—capacity to produce, manhood and its days of danger, the conditions, capacity for rapid elevation when conditions are favorable, soldierly qualities, the gift of eloquence, the power of severe, patient labor, passion for owning land, strong domestic affections, chastity, deep religious feeling.'"

**Elements of Strength**  
"Our Irish blood and our Catholic faith give us elements of strength for our American citizenship; both are sources of courage and inspiration for manhood and liberty. Our Catholic faith gives us our belief in God as the foundation of all social strength and fidelity to His truth is the norm of our life and the means of that morality which alone can save society. We can pass by the calculator and his calumny against our people as neither ignorant nor improvident, except as the vicious laws of the alien have made them so."

**Martyrdom and Massacre**  
"The free gift to some of the meanest and lowest elements of English life of the homes and lands from which the Irish were dispossessed; the martyrdoms, the massacres, the famines the exiles, are all chapters which, unfortunately, we know too well. A nation boasting of its civilization, priding itself on the right of private judgment in religion, glorying in its

strength, exulting in its Christian character and its social order, deliberately robbing a people of its nationhood and lands, then planning to rob them of their faith. After seven centuries of tyranny, misrule and religious martyrdom, the Irish people in Ireland are still strong in their faith as Catholics and strong in their determination to rule themselves. Ireland still remains distinct, having conquered the penal code and the persecutor, and held aloft as in the early centuries of her Christian life for her people a banner of spotless loyalty to the Catholic church. To the credit of the national spirit of the Irish it can be said that no power of the alien ruler has ever been able to extinguish in the people hope for ultimate freedom, nor has it been able to deter the people in their determination to work for nationhood.

**True to Catholic Teaching**  
"Through all her years Ireland has stood in the eyes of the world as synonymous with Catholicity. As a nation she has remained staunch in the faith which St. Patrick preached. Fidelity and atheism have found little place among her children. She has never run after the fads and fancies of false gods nor has she been able to tyrant been able to destroy her loyalty to the Catholic church. Remarkable in the early days of her Christian life for her fidelity to her learning, she has preserved that love despite legislation and persecution against it. At this present moment, when the barometer of literature rather than of the lower levels, when realism, which is but another name for animalism, seems to be a prominent aim in literature made to sell and not to instruct, it seems like the ignominy of fate that the thoughts of men are turning toward the Irish literature, realizing that in it is to be found that touch of the spiritual, that keen development of the imagination, that sense of the grand and the sublime, that sense of the grossly material which pervades much of modern literary thought."

**The "Celtic Fringe"**  
"Scholars of English are today conceding that one of the greatest elements of beauty in the English literature of the past is that which is termed the "Celtic Fringe," which gives to it its magic, its spiritual and romantic beauty. Strange indeed, that this acknowledgment should be made for a language and a literature which for so many centuries were used as weapons to destroy the record, the fame, and the character of the Irish people, and glorify in the fact that a stronger Christian power was needed to prevent disorder and chaos in national life."

**Flower Favorite Decoration**  
Of the personal decorations in observance of the day the green carnation was decidedly the favorite. Quantities of white carnations had been tinted green for the day by the introduction of a specially prepared green liquid through the stems of the flowers. Of course shamrocks were to be seen by the hundreds, and some of them were fearfully and wonderfully made. Many were embellished with Patrick's pipes of clay or with representations of the golden harp of Erin. Miniature reproductions of the green stovepipe hat with circular brim that the Irishman on his native heath is supposed to wear when he dons his long green coat and knee trousers and goes a-courting, to a wake or upon some other such pleasurable mission, were in evidence.

Another decoration of the day was a button on which was printed "My Irish Blood," and from which was suspended by a bright green ribbon a small corked vial containing a green liquid. Out of an abundance of caution those who sold this decoration imparted the information that the liquid was neither good nor fit to drink.
