BAPTISTS ASK PRESIDENT TO CO-OPERATE

ASSEMBLY PASSES RESOLUTIONS ON QUESTION

Would Have Government Unite with Other Nations to Deal Death Blow to White Slave Traffic

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., May 26.—Commanding general... Resolution introduced by Rev. M. P. Boynton of Chicago was passed by the Northern Baptist conference today.

Whereas, The traffic in womanhood and girls, commonly called the white slave traffic, is increasingly active in our large cities...

Whereas, Our nation is awakening to this dread evil and organizations are forming in various places...

Resolved, By the Northern Baptist association, in annual session at Oklahoma City, Okla.:

First—That we commend such organizations as purpose the destruction of this unchristianable vice.

Second—That we urge most respectfully upon President Roosevelt the high duty and desirability of our government uniting with other nations to suppress this traffic...

Third—That we encourage parents, pastors, teachers and editors to instruct the youth of our land in the sacred laws of life and health...

Fourth—That we suggest to the various state organizations action similar to that of the churches...

Fifth—That we ask our commission on special services to give this question special attention...
