

REPUBLICAN CONVENTION'S WORK MAY BE ENDED TODAY

TAFT ADHERENTS WIN PLATFORM

ANTI-INJUNCTION PLANK IS INSERTED

OPPONENTS OF ISSUE COLLAPSE SUDDENLY

Telegram from Roosevelt at Critical Time Has Good Effect on Action of Refractory Delegates

CHICAGO, June 18.—Victory for the Taft forces on the resolutions committee came with the dawn. A platform which contains an injunction plank satisfactory to the prospective candidate is embodied in the substantial structure of verbiage upon which it is to be made the secretary's appeal for popular approval.

A telegram from President Roosevelt arrived, as well as a letter and telegram from Secretary Taft, each urging action. An ultimatum in substance, if not in words, had been delivered shortly before the "fallies," which was interpreted as spelling the nomination of Roosevelt should the convention refuse a platform upon which the secretary of war could make the race with confidence.

Beginning with the adjournment of the convention on Tuesday, the work of the resolutions committee was practically continuous until 4:20 o'clock this morning, when the first platform was produced.

Text of Platform

It was not until 10 o'clock last night that the scales began to tip in favor of the administration forces, but after the dissolution of the opposition began it was rapid and soon completed, leaving nothing to mark its exit save a few of the unrecorded speeches and a slim minority of votes.

National Republican Platform
