DEMOCRATIC COUNTY CONVENTION MEETS

DELEGATES ELECTED AND COMMITTEES FORMED

Establishment of Campaign Organ Under Consideration, and Plans Formulated for Energetic Action Throughout the County

SAN BERNARDINO, July 18.—The Democratic county convention was convened today and elected delegates to the state, congressional and senatorial conventions as follows: Ernest Martin, James H. Boyd, R. E. Swing of San Bernardino, Harry Steward, A. J. Link, F. T. Harris of Redlands, E. King of Colton, John Gunderman of Highland, J. H. West of Needles and C. P. Huey of Upland.

Following the convention the new county central committee convened and organized by the election of F. P. Meserve of Redlands as chairman, T. W. Duckworth of San Bernardino as secretary and W. M. Parker of San Bernardino as treasurer. The committee is planning for a routing big meeting in this city some time early in the fall as the formal opening of the campaign.

The establishment of a campaign organ in this county, the party now being practically without a paper, is also being considered, and action along favorable lines probably will be taken. An executive committee was named by Chairman Meserve as follows: W. M. Parker, R. E. Swing, F. T. Harris, Harry Steward, R. T. Custis, Robert McGinness, Jacob Jenson, J. F. Monroe, E. King, George Miller, J. H. West, C. L. Allison, R. E. Fairchild, C. M. Brown, J. H. Boyd.

Plans are being made for a live campaign all through the county, it being confidently expected that a Democratic board of supervisors will be elected this fall.

CITY ENJOYING DECIDEDLY LIVELY BUILDING BOOM

Permits Are Increasing in Number, and Class of Structures Is of Good and Substantial Character

SAN BERNARDINO, July 18.—Work has been commenced on tearing down the old one-story structures at Third and E streets belonging to the Katz estate to make way for the handsome four-story block that is soon to be erected. Several other large buildings are under way; about the city; in fact, there is a large sized building boom. The erection of new homes in all parts of the city is one of the most favorable signs. Many are in course of erection and this week permits have been issued for nine new ones, all of a good character. The building permits total for the year continues to soar and the outlook is now that the year's figures will easily reach the half-million mark.

SECRETARY OF STATE BOARD OF HORTICULTURE RESIGNS

SAN BERNARDINO, July 18.—Word has been received here of the resignation of John Isaacs as secretary of the state board of horticulture, because of friction between himself and the newly appointed state horticulturist, J. W. Jeffrey of Los Angeles. It is understood that friction has been growing worse ever since Jeffrey went to the head of the board. Isaacs was prominent in horticultural work here for years before he took the secretaryship of the state board. According to reports he will take another clerical position and remain in the north.

HAS CLOSE ESCAPE TRYING TO RESCUE CAN OF POWDER

SAN BERNARDINO, July 18.—Irwin Swarthout had a narrow escape from being blown to smithereens while at work blasting on Little mountain, north of the city. He saw a grass fire start up some distance away, and with other workmen started to extinguish it. Failing in this, he bethought him of a large can of black powder which was endangered by the fire, and started to save it. He dashed through the fire, but was too late, as the flames already were licking the can. A moment later it exploded, throwing rocks and earth in every direction. His ankle was struck by a rock, so that he will be on crutches some days. The fire did no other damage.

OAKLAND MAN VICTIM OF GAS PIPE THUGS

OAKLAND, July 18.—Henry Bangs, 45 years of age, a watchman employed by the Pacific Coast Borax works of Alameda, was found dead in the yard of that place at 7 o'clock this morning. A piece of gas pipe found under the body, a number of deep gashes on his head and evidence of a struggle lead the police to maintain the theory of his having been murdered.

MANILA, July 18.—Thomas Kinney, one of the leading lawyers of this city, died here today of peritonitis, following an attack of appendicitis. Mr. Kinney was born in Virginia and resided in New York before coming out to the islands.
