Round Three
Carsey jabs hard left to face. They mix it furiously with Brock rushing and Carsey retreating...

Round Four
Both land lefts to body and clinch. Brock rushes Carsey to ropes. Carsey swings hard left to head and Brock falls as he misses swing...

Round Five
They begin with the usual clinch. Carsey jabs with left and, as they clinch, Brock swings lightly to jaw with left...

Round Six
Carsey swings left to wind. Carsey rights left lightly to head. Brock rushes with right and Carsey falls as he misses swing...

Round Seven
Brock swings left to wind. Both land hard rights and lefts to head. Carsey swings left to wind and Brock falls as he misses swing...

Round Eight
Carsey jabs left to face and they clinch. Brock hooks left to head and rushes with left to wind. Both jabs lefts to face...

Round Nine
Brock stages Carsey again with left to face. They mix it without damage and clinch. Brock swings left to head. Brock rushes with straight left to face...

Round Ten
Brock hooks left to head and rushes Carsey, who clinches. Brock swings right to head. Brock jabs left to chin. Carsey slams left to wind...
