L. A. HIGH TRIMS POMONA 16 TO 0

LOCALS' GOAL SELDOM IN DANGER

Claremont Eleven's Powerful, Plooding Machine Surprises Academics, but They Soon Adapt Themselves to Style of Play

Los Angeles High 16, Pomona 0
Pomona college played a game yesterday which tried Los Angeles high school's every resource and skill. Although the local team did all the scoring it was due rather to Glesler's great

punting toward the latter part of the game which invariably sent the ball out of immediate danger and into the visitors' territory.
The Pomona eleven was a powerful plodding machine which never gave the local team a minute's rest. Although it was not generally conceded that Pomona would win the game the skill they showed when tearing gaps in the high school's line and jamming back the blue and white attackers was something of a surprise to the big crowd.
High school did not show usual form yesterday which perhaps was due to the fact that they were taken off their guard during the first few minutes of play by the tremendous line bucks that Pomona sent into their midst. That they are gritty and cool and staunch however, when under fire was shown by the fact that they prevented Pomona from scoring in the second half, although the visitors on two occasions came within inches of penetrating the goal line. In each instance when Pomona apparently was about to cross the chalk terminus, the high school line steered to keep their rivals from ad-

and it went to Pomona on high school's 20-yard line. Pomona punted and Cass caught the ball on the 38-yard line and threaded his way through a broken field until he was downed by Birdsall on high school's 25-yard line. Three right and left bucks by Wingett scored the first touchdown of the game for high school. Decius missed the goal, and the score was 5 to 0 in favor of the locals.

High School Braces

After the first touchdown the high school boys seemed to brace up considerably. This was particularly apparent in the punting by Glesler, who twice punted from the 50-yard line for touchdowns during the first half. If high school did not do as well as was expected in team work they made up for it in individual playing and the standard in nowise suffered. When high school found, however, that the visitors were stronger than they had estimated, the players put on more steam and worked more determinedly as was proved during the remainder of the first half.

In getting down the field under kicks, Hunter and Grimm were dependable. Cass and Glesler, generally brilliant players, were a trifle off their game

through their left half his distance. Shortly afterward Decius succeeded in booting the ball over Pomona's goal from a place kick which made the score 9 to 0 in favor of Los Angeles high school.

Pomona kicked off to Wingett, who was unable to gain. High school tried another fake kick which enabled Wingett to go through Pomona's center for a distance. An end run followed which placed the ball directly in front of Pomona's goal and only eight yards away. It was high school's first down with the goal to gain. The second down found the ball in high school's possession and only a foot away from Pomona's goal. A left formation did the trick for high school, with Wingett carrying the pigskin and assisted across the line by Glesler and Decius. Decius again missed the goal, and the score stood 14 to 0 in high school's favor.

The remaining two points were scored by high school during the last five minutes of play after Boyle had bucked the line for slight gains on two downs. Glesler punted in the third down from Pomona's 40-yard line. The ball was fumbled by Mahoney, who was unable to recover in time to run forward, as he was being pressed by Brant, who had broken through the line, and the ball bounded behind the goal, where Mahoney fell on it, thus scoring a safety. The game ended with the score of 16 to 0 for high school.

WHITTIER SCORES ON OCCIDENTAL

QUAKERS CROSS PRESBYTERIANS' GOAL LINE

Coach Gorton's Eleven Piles Up Total of Twenty-five Points on Visitors. Thompson and Wieman Stars

Occidental 25, Whittier 6
Before a crowd of over two thousand enthusiastic rooters and fans Whittier college went down to defeat before Coach Gorton's Occidental huskies yesterday by a score of 25 to 6. Occidental played a fast game from start to finish, although the game was drawn out, due to wrangling over the interpretation of the rules.

The game was a good combination of the old and new rules, neither open or close formations being used too much. Occidental took the defensive from the start of the game and in less than two minutes of play had crossed Whittier's goal line for 5 points, and this fast start by Occidental literally won them the game.

Although beaten before the first half was over, the Quakers played hard and clean football, taking advantage of every misplay by the Presbyterians and were rewarded in the last ten minutes of play by a touchdown when 'Big' Reneker intercepted an on-side kick by Thomas and ran sixty yards for a touchdown.

Occidental outweighed Whittier about two or three on the man, and found little difficulty in bucking the Quakers' line. Thomson especially tore things up, by his hard bucks over the Whittier guards and tackles. Captain Wieman was one of the stars of the game, until he was knocked out in the last half.

Reneker and Feeler stood out like gaunts among all the rest of the Whittier players, the former making some sensational bucks and scoring the only points for his team-mates, while the latter recovered some on-side kicks, which gained about fifty yards for his team.

Game in Detail

Occidental won the toss and chose to kick off. Wieman kicked to Wells, who fumbled, but Short recovered the ball, and kicked. Thomas caught the ball and ran to the Whittier 10-yard line before being downed by Reneker. Thomas bucked five yards through center, and on the next play Johnson carried the ball over for a touchdown. Wieman punted out to Thomson, who heeled the ball and Wieman booted it over the posts, making the score 6 to 0.

Short kicked off to Collins, who ran the ball back to the 45-yard line. Whittier held and Wieman punted to Short, who returned the kick. Occidental recovering the ball on Whittier's 50-yard line. Thomson made fifteen yards around Whittier's left end, and Hopkins missed a forty-yard pass going to Whittier. Occidental held and Short punted to Thomas, who made a pretty catch of a short kick. Wieman punted and Reneker fumbled, Hopkins recovering the ball. Occidental carried the ball down the field to Whittier's 10-yard line where the Quakers held, and Short punted out of danger. On the next play Thomson broke through the center of Whittier's line on a buck and ran 40 yards for a touchdown. Wieman kicked goal. Score: Occidental 12, Whittier 6.

Short kicked off to Thomson, who ran the ball in twenty yards. Whittier held and Wieman punted to Reneker, who fumbled, and Johnson fell on the ball. Occidental missed a forward pass around their right end, and was penalized fifteen yards. Wieman punted and in three consecutive fumbles Reneker fell on the ball. Occidental got the ball on downs and Thomas received a beautiful forward pass of thirty-five yards. Just as the whistle blew at the end of the first half.

Whittier Team Scores

Short kicked off to Thomson, who ran in twenty yards. On the next play Landreth got loose on a tackle around back and ran forty yards before he was downed. He fumbled the ball as he hit the ground and a Whittier man

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
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
