

CALIFORNIA FOR TAFT BY 60,000 PLURALITY FALLS BELOW THE FIRST ESTIMATES

Decisive Victory Gained Throughout State, Although Early Reports of 75,000 are Found to be Incorrect

In every county of the state heard from Taft left Bryan far behind. California will send to congress almost a solid republican delegation.

Difficulty Due to Law Never before was such difficulty encountered in the collection of returns in this state.

In over 200 telegraph offices in the state railroad operators were not permitted to work after their daily trip of nine hours was over.

It probably will be two days before anything like a correct count of the vote in California can be made.

"I need hardly say how heartily I congratulate you, and the country even more."

He also sent the following dispatch to Representative Sherman: "I most heartily congratulate you."

No statement was made by the president tonight on the result of the election.

BRYAN HEARS NEWS OF DEFEAT (Continued from Page One) he received special reports from state chairmen and the national committee, and frequently came up stairs and read aloud the reports he had received.

West Virginia is confidently claimed by the Republicans, but the returns are meager.

Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey were striking exceptions that generally reduced Republican pluralities.

Taft carried Wisconsin by a plurality estimated at 75,000 a falling off from the Roosevelt plurality of 150,000 in 1904.

Kentucky has gone for Bryan by about 15,000.

Governor John A. Johnson of Minnesota has probably been elected governor of that state for a third term, although the state has gone for Taft.

Taft carried every so-called doubtful state except Nebraska, where the indications point to a Democratic victory.

Bryan has carried Nevada and Montana, in addition to the solid south, which includes Missouri.

Maryland is claimed by the Republicans.

Returns from Colorado are too meager to form a definite conclusion as to their ultimate alignment.

WISCONSIN Wisconsin All G. O. P. MILWAUKEE, Nov. 3.—The Republican national and state ticket were victorious in Wisconsin today by a plurality estimated at 75,000.
