

CITY OWNERSHIP OF PORT URGED MUNICIPALLY CONTROLLED HARBOR IS FAVORED BAY CITY MAN SAYS STATE POWER LEADS TO GRAFT

Because of Harriman's Pacific Interests, Speaker Advises Establishment of Federal Steamship Line, Seattle to Panama

"You should strive to have your harbor municipally owned and controlled," said Isidor Jacobs of San Francisco to the City club yesterday. "You should take prompt action to see that every steamship line plying up and down the Pacific ocean gives you a direct, regular and complete service. You are entitled to this because of the large and increasing volume of business originating in and coming to this section of the state."

Mr. Jacobs is the head of the Good Government League of San Francisco. He told the City club emphatically that Los Angeles and all other harbors in California should be municipally owned and controlled, touching upon the harbor situation in connection with his topic, "The Necessity for a Government Line of Steamers Between Pacific Coast Ports and Panama."

"In regard to harbor and shipping matters," said Mr. Jacobs, "there is little need for me to say that ever since the Pacific Steamship company line has been operating between San Francisco and Panama the competition has been neutralized. Formerly the Pacific Mail got \$75,000 a month or \$900,000 a year from the transcontinental lines in order that they might not take their business to the Atlantic. The government today is operating a line of steamers on the Atlantic doing regular commercial business. In conjunction with the Panama railroad line, which is also owned by our government, but the business people of California are faced by the peculiar condition of having to rely on the situation by doing business with the American Hawaiian Steamship company, in connection with the Mexican-owned line to Tehuantepec."

Favors Government Line "These steamers, going and coming, are loaded to the guards with freight and yet no one has ever known the Pacific Mail Steamship company to solicit through business by way of the Panama road, presumably because the Harriman interests control the Pacific Mail Steamship company. I believe on account of this fact all should strive to have the government establish a line on the Pacific from Seattle to Panama, touching at all Pacific coast ports, and thus complete the chain from the Pacific to the Atlantic in connection with the Panama railroad and the Atlantic coast government-owned line."

"Certainly we should take a broad instead of a narrow view of this subject, and Los Angeles is entitled to and should receive a complete service in connection with the system. I believe that the harbors of California should be municipally owned, because in San Francisco we have seen that state control results in a squandering of a large amount of money for state employees on the harbor front, who are controlled and dominated by the political Herrin machine, and, as a result, to use the language of Mr. Darrin, one of the present harbor commissioners at San Francisco, 'Efficiency in the service is something that they cannot hope to have under present conditions.'"

Machine Man Appointed "And yet the very following week Mr. Dennison himself appointed, under instructions of the Herrin machine, to a position on the harbor front one of the former state senators that was controlled by the Rufus-Schmitz machine at San Francisco. "As to the work of the Good Government League of San Francisco, it speaks for itself. Last year we succeeded in electing thirty-one out of thirty-two of the candidates. This year we succeeded in electing Judge Dunne to the superior court and defeating Judge Carroll Cook. "The organization is to be kept alive and is now outlining plans for the municipal election of next year. It expects to form an alliance between the best elements of the Republican party and the Democratic party, all to join together for a ticket that will be victorious, our motto being 'Citizenship Above Partisanship,' which will depend upon the adoption of the open primary election law."
