FAVORITES WAIN IN MUDDY GOING

PUBLIC CHOICES KEEP UP WINNING AVERAGE

VARIETIES RUNS OVER CARTHAGE IN LONG RACE

Sir Edward, Joe Galtens, Helma S and Bemaj Justify Confidence of Regulars by Annexing Their Respective Events

Mud was ankle deep on the Santa Anita track yesterday afternoon and strong enough to pull themselves out of the mire every time their feet went into it...

Joe Galtens proved all claims made for his mud-slinging abilities by galloping all the way in front in the third, a mile journey for three-year-olds. He wanted to quit at the eighth out, but Schilling kept him up and forced him to keep his snout in front to the wire. Steel was closing fast in the final and only for the vigorous booting Schilling gave Joe Galtens, who has won Woolwinder did not like the distance and slowed up after following the pace for three-quarters.

Bemaj Wins Another Bemaj, the consistent Millard mare that won enough in two seasons to furnish her owner with a goodly amount of ranches and an increased bank account, came right back and repeated her previous victory in the fourth, defeating Snow Ball, a good thing with odds half a mile long tacked against his chances. Monvina ran just where she figured and landed the show money. Talagrand refused to break and after the field had turned home, he was forced to quit dancing and waiting about the track and was galloped to a formal finish.

Lasata, another of Hyland's good things, delivered the goods most handsly by winning the last race of the day after being heavily supported in the ring. Antigo made the pace, but found the route too exacting in the going and quit after turning for home, allowing Old Settler to look like a winner for a few seconds. Then the good thing came hustling along and easily romped over his field to victory by nearly four lengths. Old Settler placed ahead of Antigo. None of the others ever was dangerous at any time.

MUDLARKS RUN FORMFULLY AND FOUR FAVORITES ARE VICTORIOUS



Quite an attractive card is offered at Santa Anita this afternoon, even if it is Friday and the track will be heavy. While four of the six events are selling affairs, two purses are offered in which fair performers are carried to start and in all events will be found horses that have an established form and are popular favorites. The fields will be large in all except the fourth race, and a few new ones will go to the post. The fourth race occupies the position on the card usually allotted to the feature event, but it hardly will outline the opening number when the public gaze is directed at these two races. Lawton Wiggins, the crack 3-year-old that Walter House brought out of the east last fall, and John A., the phenomenally fast Texas horse that has been doing so little to show for his extreme speed, will sprint in the first race, while Maltbie, Summer Cloud, Chippewa, Tavora and Paul I will make up the field in the fourth. Scratches will be numerous, in all probability, although the fields are so evenly balanced that almost any of the contenders could win without fracturing form to any extent.

The second game in the amateur three-dimension billiard tournament was played last night at Berry's Hoffman parlors, Howard winning from Davidson by the score of 50 to 52. Howard's game was a masterpiece, his play turning the 30-point division, but thereafter he played fast and classy billiards to the end and wound up the game by making the final point in a pretty and difficult around-the-table bank. This makes Howard the leader with a perfect score, having played in both games of the tournament so far and being returned the winner in each. Play will be continued nightly until the round-robin schedule is completed. The games begin every night at 8:30 o'clock and usually require about an hour and a half to complete the run of fifty points.

Both these bouts are so attractive that the biggest bunch of Los Angeles sports that ever went to the Gate city to a fight will attend. Gregg was defeated by Howard Baker last Tuesday night, but made such a good showing against this high class and very clever and speedy boxer that the public is sure to flock to the ring again. English is a crack worker, and the Gate city fans will witness an exciting and interesting exhibition when the pair meet.

Several horsemen and their families who reside in Monrovia and usually drive their autos or buggies over to the track every day had to return home on the electric cars, owing to the high water in the San Gabriel wash between Arcadia and Monrovia. Both roads were impassable and warning was sent to the horsemen at the track not to attempt to ford the streams or take any chances of getting stuck in the mud.
