John Gowan Internally Injured While Being Run Down Between Bases in Contest at the Palms Yesterday

John Gowan, better known as "Frisco," and well known among the amateur ball players of Los Angeles, lies at the Crocker street hospital in a critical condition, the result of an unusual accident.

While playing at Palms yesterday afternoon in a game between the All-Stars of Los Angeles and the Palms team.

In the seventh inning Frisco went to bat and made an infield hit, which placed him on the initial sack. Anxious to annex a stolen base, and after sliding the pitcher of the Palms club he tripped and fell and was trampled upon by the second and third basemen of White House steward and got into a mad mix-up trying to put the "out" sign on him.

Gowan was unable to rise and it was apparent that he was seriously injured. He responded to ordinary treatment, his friends became alarmed and he was placed in an automobile and rushed to Los Angeles, the chauffeur having all records in reaching this city.

An examination by Dr. H. L. Hutchinson showed that Gowan was suffering from internal injuries, including several fractured ribs. It was one of those unavoidable accidents that occasionally happen in baseball and that it was not intended to be caused by foul tactics was the general report of those at the game. It has been suggested that a benefit game be arranged for the injured player, who, according to the attending physician, will be in the hospital for several months, as it is feared that serious complications may develop.
