UNABLE TO RECOVER LOST MAIL PACKAGE

Business Men Will Be Asked to Assist in Work of Guiding Orphaned and Wayward Young Men

The Fishermen's club, under the supervision of Charles T. Youngken, has appointed a committee of eight to be known as the "big brother" committee. The object of the committee is to rescue the hundreds of boys adrift on the streets of Los Angeles, discharged from the detention home or brought before the juvenile court. The principal feature of the plan, however, is to provide as many boys as possible with guardians.
