WOULD IMPROVE CENTER OF CITY

ASSOCIATION IS FORMED TO PROMOTE INTERESTS

Taxpayers Who Own Property in Territory Near Heart of Los Angeles Meet to Organize for Advancement

The Northern and Northwest Improvement association of Los Angeles was organized yesterday

Owing to the growth of Los Angeles toward a southerly direction it has been thought advisable by many of the property owners in the districts west of Third street to take active steps

The facts of the case were well set forth by Will D. Gould in a brief address to the assembled company

"The Plaza is the natural center of Los Angeles. When the city was planned this was seen to be the natural center of the town

"The residents of our section of the city must wake up. All we need is a little more enterprise and we will be an equal footing with the rest of Los Angeles.

"The federal building rapidly is nearing completion. It is there to stay. The county courthouse is also here, and I believe the city hall, which is a nuisance on Broadway, should also be located in this section of the city.

Officers Are Elected... Officers were elected to serve the following year, as follows: Joseph Mesmer, president; Oscar C. Mueller, Will D. Gould, F. M. Coulter, Victor Pont, Marshall Stimson, M. H. Newmark, Philip L. Wilson and M. L. Weeks, vice presidents and directors; John Castana, treasurer, and J. Mills Davies, secretary.

A document was presented to which nearly fifty prominent firms and property owners had affixed their signatures promising to support the association and to contribute \$1 per month dues.

Among the questions which will be dealt with will be the building of a union station near the Plaza, the construction of a large tunnel on Second street from Broadway to Figueroa street, and the development of streets, parkways and public playgrounds in the northwest section of the city.

Meetings of the Northern and Northwest Improvement association of Los Angeles will be held on the first and third Thursdays of every month, and it is expected before long the total enrollment will be more than 500 persons.


