

YOUNG MEN CREATE TROUBLE IN SALOON SMASH GLASSWARE AND HURL GLASSES AT BARTENDER

After Beating Inoffensive Citizen and Throwing Rocks at House, Trio Charges on Thirst Parlor. Resist Arrest

After brutally beating William Hanna of 4020 South Alameda street, because he remonstrated with them for throwing stones, tin cans and bricks at his house, and then attempting to wreck a saloon at 1916 East Thirty-eighth street, by throwing missiles at the bartender and glassware, Saturday night, Charles and Harry Steele of Thirty-ninth and Alameda streets, arrested by Patrolman Russell, assisted by six citizens, and taken to the University station and booked on charges of disturbing the peace. A companion, who participated in the affair but whose name is not known to the police, made his escape during the fight.

Three young men appeared at the home of Hanna and began to yell and otherwise disturb the neighborhood. Tiring of this, they began to bombard the home of Hanna with stones, tin cans and bricks. When Russell appeared the lads strenuously resisted arrest and made a desperate and concerted effort to overpower the officer. Russell called for assistance, and six citizens responded.

The two Steele brothers finally were subdued and placed under arrest. The third member of the gang made his escape during the fight and was not captured. The two prisoners refused to give the name of their companion or to give any reason for their unusual conduct.

They will be arraigned in police court this morning.
