LOS ANGELES PLANS UNSELFISH AND REAL RECEPTION Suggestion of Chief Executive Outlined by Brother-in-Law at Meeting in Chamber of Commerce Last Night

Tentative plans for the reception of President Taft when he arrives in Los Angeles October 11 were made last night at a meeting of the general reception committee in the rooms of the chamber of commerce.
