

PART II BEAUMONT SALES TOTAL \$500,000 APPLE VALLEY LANDS ATTRACT HOMESEEEKERS

Review of Colonization Work Accomplished by Los Angeles Corporation—Postoffice Receipts Grow

Recent snows and cold weather have given much added strength to the demand for Beaumont apple lands.

So heavy has the call become for apple lands in the La Mesa Miravilla tract, which is about 3100 feet above the sea, that an augmented force of laborers has been engaged in clearing the brush from large areas of virgin soil.

Recapitulation at the beginning of the new year shows that in about thirty months the aggregate sales of the Beaumont Land and Water company are rapidly approaching \$500,000.

Indicating healthy growth is the report of Postmaster Kelly for the quarter ended December 31, showing an increase in receipts of 60 percent, \$28,833 as against \$17,983 for the same period last year, the government figures.
