

PROPOSED CHANGES IN FOOTBALL RULES TO GET EXPERIMENTAL TEST

MEMBERS OF REVISION COMMITTEE TO TRY OUT ALL SUGGESTIONS THAT ARE PRACTICABLE

Two College Elevens Are to Be Engaged to Demonstrate Workings of All the Amendments That Have Been Offered by the Various Experts, and These Experiments Will Be Staged on Southern Gridirons Before Date of Meeting of Board, Which Occurs Next Month—Desired Changes Are Radical

NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—According to letters and dispatches from the south, it will not be an entirely theoretical set of conditions which will confront the football rules committee when it meets in this city next month.

In the interim, the leading members of the committee expect to conduct a series of experiments which will enable them to grasp in a practicable manner the effect of some of the proposed changes in the football playing code.

At the University of Virginia, at Charlottesville, Dr. W. A. Lambeth, who is a member of the rules committee, will experiment, using the members of the first and second elevens of that institution.

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


