

DEFER ACTION ON COFFROTH'S PERMIT

Board of Supervisors in San Mateo County Take Promoter's Application Under Adversive

REDWOOD CITY, Feb. 21.—For the first time in several years action upon an application for a prize fight permit made by James W. Coffroth, the San Francisco promoter, was deferred for thirty days by the board of supervisors here today.

Coffroth's arena at Colma, San Mateo county, has been the scene of some of the biggest championship fights, and the promoter has never before had any difficulty in securing the sanction of the authorities here to stage the contests for which he held contracts.

A protest against the granting of the permit had been made by a number of citizens, but obstacles appearing in the path of permits previously had been overcome.
