

3 MORE POLICE STATIONS URGED

Chief Galloway, at Banquet, Explains Needs of Department

NEW 'UNIVERSITY' OPENED

City Officials Attend Inspection and Later Are Entertained at Dinner

Following the banquet arranged by Chief Galloway at the formal opening of the new University police station at 825 West Jefferson street last night, strong speeches were made in favor of three more police stations, a larger police force and increased pay for the officers.

STATISTICS ON DISTRICT

"This lot on which this building stands was purchased by the city in 1904 at a cost of \$1000," he said. "It is now worth \$4875, an increase of 300 per cent in value."

NEEDS OF EAST SIDE

"The east side is the next place where we must have a police station. This district embraces a large territory and the 35,000 inhabitants in that section are protected by a captain, several sergeants and twenty-four patrolmen."

Mayor Alexander was then introduced as the man who ably performed his duty as mayor of Los Angeles.

GROWTH LEADS TO NEW NEEDS

Mayor Alexander said he approved of most of Chief Galloway's speech; that an increase in the police department was not the only department that cried for more men. He declared the fire department, the street department and other departments needed more men. The mayor stated that Los Angeles is growing faster than any other city in the world, and the needs follow naturally.

"It will be hard work to get through the year with the appropriations made last July," said Mayor Alexander. "We don't want to increase the tax rate any more than we have to, and I don't want you to blame the council. We have the best in the country, and everything possible is being done to adjust matters."

Police Judge Warren L. Williams, who will hold court at the University station, made a short speech stating that he would be glad to welcome persons to the station if they called socially, but if they were taken there under arrest he would do them the best he could as the city needs the money.


DEPARTMENT IS PRAISED


