

ARREST 5 ACCUSED BUCKETSHOP MEN

U. S. Deputies Hurl Bombshell in Group of New York Speculators

BIG SWOOP ON BOGGS & CO.

Two Give Selves Up Following Arrests—Violations Charged in Grain Deals

NEW YORK, April 2.—The bureau of investigation of the federal department of justice swooped down here today on the offices of E. S. Boggs & Co., armed with warrants from Washington, charging violation of the federal bucketshop law of 1908. Three arrests were made, and while the men were being arraigned Louis A. Cella and his brother Angelo of St. Louis, millionaire turfmen and speculators, walked into court and surrendered themselves.

BIG FELLOWS AFRAID
